

Dear Mr. Rosenfeld,

Recently I was asked by a group of Ripley Manufacturing Co. employees to give them an explanation as to how the piece-workers are paid by the firm.

As you no doubt are well aware, the method of payment used by the Ripley Manufacturing Co. is unlike any other in the coat and suit industry or at least in my experience.

It would appear to me that the payment of piece-workers in the coat and suit industry during the long Fall coat producing season on the basis of their average hourly earnings of the short, layoff-studded Spring season would mean a considerable loss of earnings to the workers. It would also appear that the payment to the piece-workers of the average hourly earnings of the very short, layoff-studded Spring coat producing season during the long full employment of the Fall coat producing season would result in a still greater loss to most piece-

From my knowledge of the industry and the information gleaned from a number of Ripley Manufacturing Co. piece-workers as to the relative length of the Fall coat producing season to the Spring coat producing season, I have found that the loss to a piece-worker may run as high as several hundred dollars per year. I assume that you know, as well as I, the Spring coat producing season is a much shorter season than the Fall coat producing season and requires less personnel so that a piece-worker does not have the opportunity to get the benefit of her higher Fall season average.

There would appear to me, in all fairness, no logical reason why piece-workers should not at when work was sparse months ago.

I would appreciate any explanation you may have for adopting a system of payment that to me, as well as many of your piece-workers to be unfair.

MINIMIZING COTTON HARVEST LOSS

hortages and competition from other fibers now nake it necessary for cotton growers to produce more on fewer acres. Harvesting cost being such a part of the total expense of producing a bale cotton, it is imperative that picking be done as efficiently as possible with a minimum of losses.

SPINDLE-TYPE PICKERS are vastly improved. This year IH pickers will have a contoured compressor sheet wich allows the spindles to have full penetration of the plant for a longer distance. Previously, was free to be pushed out of reach of the spindle.

An additional device which also reduces tagging is a low boll attachment, a curved steel finger which mounts on the bottom of each picker-bar. The fingers sweeps under and lifts low branches while "backing g up" the bottom spindle.

OILS, ALCOHOLS, OTHER AGENTS are now some operators. Although their use results in greater field efficiency, the practice is not recommended.

Preliminary research indicates that fiber quality may be damaged by the material. Already there are reports that buyers offer a lower price for cotton known to have been picked with the aid of these materials. With further research, suitable moistening agents will undoubtedly be developed soon,

On What Shall A Nation's Walls Be Set?

Nations like persons have foun-dations, good or bad. People sometimes wonder if we deceive ourselves when we prefer a democratic state to any other kind. Looking at other experiments in democracy, with the exception of the northern European nations, so-called democracies will not seem very attractive. Is there anything special about American democracy (which is a child, or a first cousin, of the democracies in northern Europe just men-tioned)? Yes, there is, and this should be said in thankfulness and without pride, for we had nothing to do with it. There was a long, long period of growth, of trial and error, of practice, you might say, in democratic processes, before we started it over here. We blame the Congolese for making a mess of their country the minute they reach freedom. But would we have done any better with our nation if we had had no foundations? And it should not be forgotten that a corner-stone of our foundation is a long-time faith. "In God we trust" as a motto is worth little; as a foundation it is indis-




