Three Cities Map Drive To Poison Rats Next Week

Halls, Gates, Ripley Using Bait; Durhamville-Orysa Chiefs In Jackson Fete

By F. H. Paschal Ripley, Halls, and Gates will car-ry out city-wide rat campaigns

Crews of men will distribute Squill meat bait at every home and warehouse and other places where rats are likely to come to spend the winter.

Dry Pival bait will be distributed in small paper bags in stores and homes and other places inside buildings where rats and mice may be a problem.

The cities are paying all the costs of these campaigns, but they earnestly request the cooperation of every householder in reporting the places where rats have been seen and in keeping dogs and other pets from eating the bait for a few days so that the rats may get

The Squill meat bait will not kill any animal except rats. Pival bait will kill an animal which eatsit three or more times, but it is: much less attractive to pets.

Paul Craig, of Ripley, really believes in soil testing. Last fall, he bought a farm near Pleasant Hill on which a lot of lime had been applied. Paul carefully took soil samples:

and sent them to the Extension Laboratory for testing to get fertilizer recommendations for corn... cotton, soy beans, and other crops. He then applied the lime and fertilizers recommended. In spite of the ten weeks of dry weather this season, Paul made on rolling hill land, an average of

bushels of corn, and 40 bushels of soy beans. He fertilized the soy beans as well as the corn and cotton. Paul says that he not only gets better yields by soil testing but that "it. saves money on fertilizer."

No doubt the lime previously applied on much of this land increased yields this year more than if lime had been applied this year. Experiments show that it takes several months for lime to be fully effective in making phosphate and potash and nitrogen fertilizers operate at top efficiency. Soil samples may be sent to the
