**REJECTED CORNERSTONE**

Lesson for April 4, 1971

Background Scripture: Matthew 21:1-17, 33-46  
Devotional Reading: Isaiah 53:1-12

Sometimes the parables of Jesus required some deep thinking before their significance was comprehended by his listeners. This was not true of the parable which he tells in Matthew 21:33-46. His audience surely recognized the meaning of "vineyard," for Isaiah had spoken of Israel as God's planted vineyard.

My beloved had a vineyard on a very fertile hill. He dug it and cleared it of stones, and planted it with choice vines; he built a watchtower in the midst of it, and hewed out a vine vat in it; and he looked for it to yield grapes, but it yielded wild grapes (Isaiah 5:1a, 2).

**The rebellious tenants**

So it was not a flattering reference to Israel for the prophet was saying that, despite the tender care God gave his vineyard, it was unfruitful, failing to yield the results he had intended. Once again, then, Jesus is comparing Israel to a vineyard. This time the inference is not that the land is unfruitful, but that the tenants who tend it are rebellious against the owner, refusing to give him the fruits which are rightly his. This parable came as a terrible condemnation to the religious leaders in Jesus' day for Jesus is picturing them as willfully rebellious against God. The problem is not that they don't know any better, nor that they are simply making a mistake, but that they are willfully choosing to rebel against God. It was bad enough for Jesus to suggest that they were wrong, but for him to say that they were knowingly rebelling against God must have been a bitter slap in the face.

As Bishop Gerald Kennedy has said, "One of the hardest things to understand about Jesus is his constant attack on classes of people we admire most." These men were zealous advocates of the Jewish faith; they were almost fanatical in their observance of the law; surely he should not have found fault with them!

But he did. And the fault he found was the fault of arrogant pride. They were not humble tenants on God's vineyard, but proud and willful men who were bent on having their own way. It was pride in their supposed moral righteousness that caused them to turn a deaf ear to the prophets.

**He sent his son**

This is not ancient history but also a description of our own contemporary situation today. God has the greatest difficulty in getting through to those of us who should be easiest to reach, yet, because of our self-righteousness, are most likely to turn a deaf ear to his messengers. Like Israel, the Church is often tempted to take the vineyard into our own hands, to enjoy its fruits and ignore the one who owns it.

In the parable and in Jesus' life, the son also was rejected and, in fact, put to death. This, Jesus points out clearly, is a rebellious, defiant act against the Father himself. So it was not just Jesus whom Israel rejected, but God.

Jesus, who should have been the cornerstone of a renewed Judaism, was utterly rejected by the very people who most should have accepted him. One cannot help but wonder whether we today might stand where they did. Of all people, we should receive the Christ at work in the world today. All that we do should be built upon this cornerstone, yet are we not in danger of rejecting him even as they did?

## Countian, Biographer Of Malcolm X, Links Own Life To Gambia Capture

Alex Haley, 49, who spent most of his boyhood near Henning, has turned from the biography of Malcolm X to his own history and will publish it in September under the title, "Before This Anger."

Haley, retired Coast Guardsman who teaches black history in the University of California in Berkeley, took notes from Malcolm X and compiled his life story, but his own story has required seven years of international research.

He spins a yarn few Negro Americans can match: he can trace his ancestors back to a Mandingo tribesman in Gambia who was shackled and taken aboard a slave ship while away from his village gathering wood.

"Most people, blacks included, think our history starts in this country—on the plantation," Haley said recently.

"But we have a tradition that goes back to the mother country." Many white Americans would have no trouble tracing their genealogy. They can trace their past more easily than blacks because they have records and family stability not found among slaves. But this doesn't mean we don't have a past.

Haley's interest in his past was sparked by his maternal grandmother, whose knowledge of their family's history went back to the Gambia ancestor. She was born in about 1870, he said.

"When I was a child, she used to tell stories that had been passed down from generation to generation. By passing them on, she was acting in the best tradition of African oral history. I remember how she used strange clicking sounds in relating tales, and I heard those same sounds when I went to Gambia."

Haley said his Gambia ancestor, who was led off a slave ship at Annapolis harbor in 1767, was sold to a Virginia plantation owner in Spotsylvania County. After a third attempt at escape from the plantation, one of the slave's feet was cut off.

For Haley's purposes of tracing genealogy, this was a plus. His ancestor thus had a distinct mark of identification that would be noted in most records. It also virtually ruled out the probability of his being sold to another slave owner and gave the ancestor some geographic stability.

His ancestor later married a cook on the plantation, and they had several children, some of whom were sold to slave owners in North Carolina. The family lineage remained in North Carolina until after the Civil War when they moved west to Tennessee in a wagon train.

Haley's father, an agriculture professor, taught for 40 years at several Negro colleges in the South.

For his research, the author said he relied heavily on conversations with elderly people who knew his relatives. "The difficulty was going back two and three generations," he said. "People have died. Records are scarce."

He found wills more accurate than bills-of-sales, because the former always included the mention of names, which was not always true of the latter.

Haley said he has interested many of his Negro students in tracing their genealogies.

"Most blacks are probably only superficially interested in doing this," he said. "Most couldn't do it because families have been broken, and no records were kept."

"But once the book comes out, there may be a lot of people who will try the same thing. And anyone will be a stouter person if he knows his past."

## County Field Has Live Corn Blight

Samplings From Nine Other West Tennessee Counties Show The Same Results

Live corn blight organisms have been found in samples of standing stalks, waste on the ground, and material in the ground, taken from a field between Ripley and Arp.

Similar samples from nine other West Tennessee counties all contained live organisms capable of repeating last year's infestation, which cut corn yields 10% nationally.

Experts say that wet seasons of ten days or more seem to be necessary for the disease to build up to a high point, but when this occurs, one corn plant can produce enough spores to infest all the corn in one state, if it could be distributed evenly.

Corn producers are still trying to find seed corn containing 100% normal cytoplasm of recommended varieties.

Second generation corn produced from normal cytoplasm last year may be the best seed that some producers can get. This will not be likely to have the blight, and it can produce yields 80% as high as normal hybrids.

### Okra Demonstration Set

Horace Wardlow, of Arp, has agreed to act as demonstrator on two plots of okra to compare the yields from two methods of fertilizing.

Soil samples will be taken from one plot and sent to the laboratory for testing, and this plot will be fertilized according to the recommendation from the laboratory. The other plot will be fertilized as it would have been had the test not been made.

Mr. Wardlow will keep the okra from each plot separate from the other, so that total yields can be determined.

tested for the presence of Race 4 cyst nematodes. Pickett soybeans are not resistant to this new type of nematodes.

The laboratory found no Race 4 nematodes in this soil and advised Mr. Crutcher that he could safely plant Pickett or Dyer varieties of beans with the hope of normal yields.

Johnny Carmack sent soil samples from one of his soybean fields for a similar test, which has not been completed.

Other interested farmers may get these tests made on request to the County Extension Office.

### Vegetable Weeds Hurt

Gean Jenkins, J. W. Pittman, and L. M. Hutcherson are interested in growing vegetable crops and keeping them clear of weeds with very little hoeing.

A review of weed chemicals available shows that Treflan, incorporated into the soil before planting, will not injure snap and lima beans, broccoli, cabbage, okra, peas, peppers, and tomatoes.

Dacthal will control weeds without injury in crops of turnips, kale, mustard, sweet potatoes, squash, muskmelons, strawberries, egg plants, and tomatoes.

Also qualified are James Davis and Johnny Free. Davis is employed by a contractor erecting a bridge across the Mississippi River at Boothspoint. Free is associated with his mother-in-law, Mrs. Lynn Vaden, in Vaden's Cleaners.

### 2, 4-D For Onions

Joe Craig, on Highway 51 near Gates, has plenty of Bermuda in his lawn, but he has more wild onions and yellow topped weeds than he wants. He is considering putting four tablespoons of ester 2, 4-D per gallon of water with a tablespoon of detergent and spraying these weeds to kill them, roots and all, before he starts mowing. He should spray when the temperature is 60 or above.

## Firm Giving Halls New Fire Station

Tupperware Tops Truck Aid With \$25,000 For Station; All City Offices Moving

As a new \$23,000 fire truck, a gift from Tupperware Co., was delivered to Halls Wednesday, Phil Balcom, company vice-president and general manager of the Halls plant, announced that the firm is presenting the town with a check for \$25,000 to erect a fire station to house the new truck.

The fire station will connect with the south side of the recently completed water plant. Additional office space in it will be connected with the water plant so that all city offices can be moved to the new location.

More than 29,000 feet of floor space, including hose storage racks, etc., will be included in the new building. Bids for the erection of the station will be called for this month, according to Mayor Sammie Arnold.

The new fire truck will pump 750 gallons of water per minute. New hose for the truck will be delivered this week.

In making the presentation for Tupperware, Mr. Balcom said that the plastics manufacturing firm is delighted with its Halls location and is anxious to help in any way possible. Tupperware employs more than 750 persons.

Training of the 20-man volunteer fire department with the new truck is to start next week. Joe Clyde Escue, utility superintendent and fire chief, said that Lewis Baker, of Collierville, a representative of the Tennessee Department of Education, will teach a series of classes.

Chief Escue said that the old fire truck will remain in use.

## Experts Examine Earthquake Site

Earthquake experts from three universities have visited the farm of Paul Keltner, between Edith and Dry Hill, where five acres, sunken 12 to 48 feet are thought to mark the center of the tremor felt Nov. 16th as far away as Blacksburg, Va.

A University of Mississippi representative visited the farm the weekend after Mr. Keltner discovered the sunken area March 18th.

Visitors last weekend were Richard G. Stearns and David B. Smith, of Vanderbilt University in Nashville, and Ross R. Heinrich, of St. Louis, Mo., University.

Heinrich said he may arrange for a seismograph to be set up on the site for a few days to see if it records any further earth movement.

## State's Hwy. Dept. Attacks Sore Spot

A single maintenance supervisor in each county — some of which now have three or four — will report directly to a district engineer in a state highway department effort to eliminate what it calls "an old sore spot with the taxpayers — the maintenance crew composed of two repairmen and four men watching them work."

Engineers will develop semi-monthly work schedules for each county. Each supervisor will have a manual of guidelines on efficient crew sizes, materials needed, best techniques, and time required for various jobs. For example, roadside mowing is scheduled for grass nine to twelve inches tall, to be cut to no less than four inches.

The department hopes the program will stretch maintenance dollars 20%.

Important Notice To Dog Owners

All dog owners are hereby notified that "The Tennessee Anti-Rabies Law" as passed by the 1957 legislature and approved by the Lauderdale County Court will be enforced throughout the county.

All Dogs 3 Months of Age Must Be Vaccinated by A Veterinarian

This law requires that all dogs in the county be vaccinated by a licensed veterinarian and licensed at the County Trustee's office on or before the 1st day of June 1971, and of each year thereafter, paying a county license fee of One Dollar (\$1.00) for each dog owned, kept, or harbored.

The law also requires that a certificate of rabies vaccination in date must be presented at the time of getting license and that no license certificate shall be issued unless a certificate of rabies vaccination is produced for each dog to be licensed.

In order to help dogs owners get their dogs vaccinated, the following vaccination clinics have been set up throughout the county and a charge of \$1.50 for each dog vaccinated will be made by the veterinarian at these clinics. A rabies control officer will accompany the veterinarian to these clinics and all dogs can be licensed at these clinics. The rabies officer will be on duty full-time thereafter, picking up dogs without tags.
