ON TELLING AND SHOWING

Lesson for December 9, 1972.

Background Scriptures: John 1:28-31; 10:22-30.

"If you are the Christ," said the crowd to Jesus, "tell us plainly" (John 10:24). Has it ever occurred to you in reading the gospels how frequently Jesus seemed to resist all attempts to make him define himself by the use of the titles? (John 10:24-25)

Although he did not absolutely reject the titles that men gave him, neither did he seem anxious to claim them. In fact, there were numerous occasions when he steadfastly refused to discuss the matter. He seemed to have a definite aversion to telling people "plainly" who or what he was.

More Energy Crisis

We have long suspected, and now we are completely convinced that no one knows anything about anything.

Some time back President Nixon named Colorado Gov. John Love to head an energy group. Gov. Love favored rationing and perhaps was a little too slow in taking action, although we failed to perceive any support that he was receiving, and now he is out, and Mr. Nixon has named William Simon, an investment banker, no less, to head an energy group at cabinet level.

Another reason for his avoidance of titles was that he did not want to be bogged down in theological dispute. A good example of how this could happen is found in John 10 where we find him referring to God as "My Father" (10:29). Immediately, his critics pounce on his words, saying: "We stone you . . . for blasphemy; because you, being a man, make yourself God" (10:33). It is the word "Father" and the implication that Jesus is his "son" that is at the heart of their contention with him. Jesus attempts to show them in the scriptures that his use of the term is not blasphemous, but they are too immersed in their theology and doctrine to see his point.

Farmers Racing Flood Crest For Soybean Harvest

Soybean harvesting has reached a high pitch for the last seven days as farmers in low-lying areas of the county rushed to beat threatened flooding by the Mississippi River.

Seven combines thrashed for Eugene Meeks in the Hale's Point bottom in muddy conditions. Thirteen were reported in one Ashport producer's fields as farmers sided each other to beat the water.

Clifford Sweat Home at Lightfoot

John Sneed Home on Lackey Lane

John Sneed home on Lackey Lane uses traditional Yuletide colors, with Christmas music heard throughout from built-in stereo. A live tree in the living room will be decorated with the "twelve days of Christmas." Visitors will note an 11-foot mural in the dining room, pegged oak flooring and exposed beams in the den, an oak table, ladder-back chairs, and ice-box in the eating area, and Teresa's bedroom, in yellow and orange. The County Home Demonstration Council will use proceeds of the tour for 4-H Club and charity activities.

Charles Gilliland, of Route 4, Ripley, last week received results on four soil tests, all above pH 7, with high phosphate and low potassium levels. All that was recommended for his soybeans for the 1974 crop year was 40 pounds of potash. This can be quite a saving for him.

Farmers interested in soil tests can secure boxes at various locations and return them to the same location to be picked up and shipped to the laboratory. The cost of each test is \$6. Soil is shipped through the County Extension Office at no cost. Results require two weeks.

Danny Irvin is making plans to control lice on his beef herd. He will walk the cows through a chute and pour the control chemical down the backline of the cow with a dipper. The lice move around enough to get into the chemical.

Two liquid chemicals are Ronnel, to be mixed one part to four of water, and Ruelene 20E, to be mixed 1/2 gallon to two gallons of water.

He will use this solution at the rate of one ounce per 100 pounds of weight, not exceeding eight ounces per cow, regardless of weight.

Weather after Thanksgiving is usually cold enough to begin thinking about curing hams and bacon.

Very few people kill hogs nowadays, but many buy hams from packing houses to cure for their own use.

One of the better curing mixtures is made by mixing eight pounds of salt, three pounds of sugar, and three ounces of saltpetre to 100 pounds of meat.

Put the first application on as soon as the meat has been chilled, the second application the fifth day, and the third application five days later.

Hams and shoulders should be kept on cure about two days per pound of individual pieces, except bacon should not be kept more than 14 to 18 days, according to thickness.

The best quality cured meat comes from hogs weighing about 250 pounds. When temperatures begin to stay around 40 degrees, the meat can be safely cured with salt or dry sugar cure.

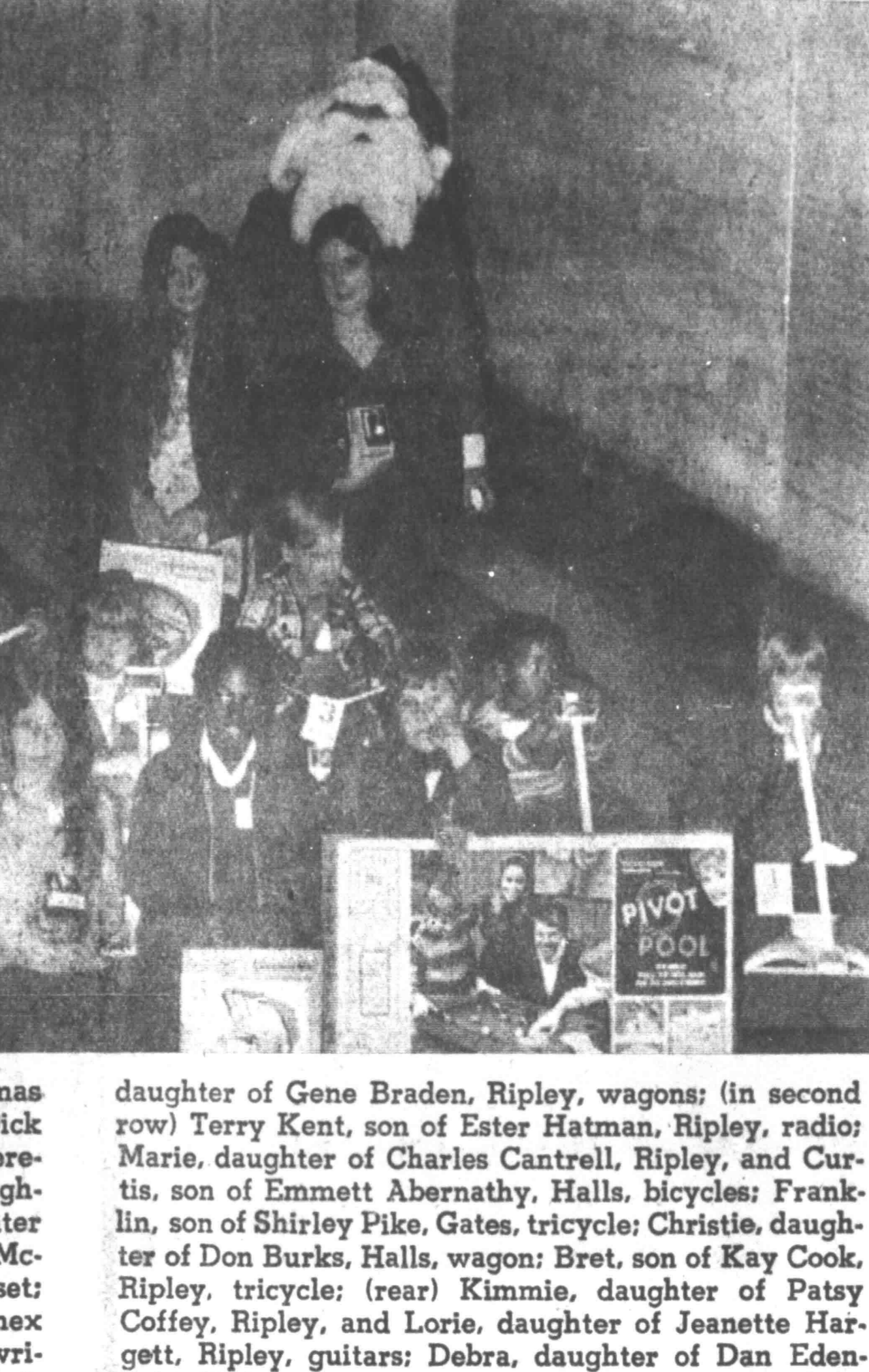

The Four Essentials Of The Kingdom (No. 3)
In this series of lessons, we have noted that Christ is the King over His kingdom and that this kingdom was established in Jerusalem and is universal in nature. (Isa. 2:1-4; Acts 2). But there can be no kingdom without subjects or citizens. This lesson will be concerned with the citizens of the Kingdom of Christ.
Prior to the ascension of Christ the kingdom was future. (Isa. 2; Matt. 3:2; 4:17). From Pentecost onward (Acts 2), the Kingdom of Christ is described as being in existence. The sacred writer declares, "Wherefore we receiving a kingdom which cannot be moved, let us have grace, whereby we may serve God acceptably with reverence and godly fear." (Heb. 12:28). The word Paul said that Christians at Colosse had been translated into the kingdom. (Col. 1:13), which means that they were subjects of the kingdom that was in existence. Paul speaks of our citizenship being in heaven. (Phil. 3:20). This means that Christians are citizens of a heavenly kingdom. Of course, our king is in heaven. (Acts 2:29; 9:5). The apostle Paul teaches that we can owe allegiance to a govern-

ment of this world and pay taxes to support it and obey its laws (Rom. 13: 1-7); but the apostles in Jerusalem taught that we must be loyal to heaven's king in preference to earthly power when the two conflict in their demands. (Acts 4:19; 5:29).
One becomes a citizen of the Kingdom of Christ like the people in the church at Colosse. These people heard the preaching of the gospel and obeyed it, and in so doing, they became New Testament Christians and citizens of Christ's Kingdom. Jesus said, "Not everyone that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the Kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven." (Matt. 7:21). The word lord means ruler. Thus, Jesus is teaching that we should not acknowledge Him as our Ruler or King unless we obey Him. (cf. Lu. 6:46; Joh. 14:15). Further, we are to believe that by believing that He is the Son of God (Jno. 8:24), by repenting of our sins (Lu. 13:3); by confessing Him before men (Matt. 10:32); and by being baptized into Him. (Rom. 6:4; Gal. 3:27).
