THE GRACE OF GOD (No. 4)

In one of our beautiful hymns we have the following words, "Amazing grace how sweet the sound that saved a wretch like me! I once was lost but now I'm found, was blind, but now I see."

The apostle Paul wrote that "For by grace are ye saved through faith, and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: not of works, lest any man should boast." (Eph. 2:8-9). Also, he reveals that this saving grace has appeared unto all men. (2:11-12).

Many are preaching that the fact that we are saved by grace excludes baptism. But these scriptures prove that baptism, the same as faith and repentance is unto salvation. No one is saved by grace until he gets into Christ. Paul said, "Be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus." (2 Tim. 2:1). Notice that grace is "in Christ Jesus." Again, Paul declared, "Being justified freely by his grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus." (Rom. 3:24). Here we learn that we must have the "redemption that is in Christ Jesus" in order to be justified by His grace. The apostle speaks, therefore, of "the salvation which is in Christ Jesus." (2 Tim. 2:10, cf. Acts 4:12). The next thing to consider is, how does one get into Christ where salvation by grace may be obtained? Many people don't like the answer, but God has given a plain and pointed answer to the question. Paul says, "Know ye not, that so many of us as were baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into his death? (Rom. 6:3). Here we learn that one is "baptized into Jesus Christ." This is the way to be saved by grace through faith. God by grace provides salvation in Christ, and we by faith are moved to be baptized into Christ where we are partakers of His grace. Paul again writes, "Ye are all children of God by faith in Christ Jesus. For as many of you as have been baptized into Christ have put on Christ." (Gal. 3:26-27). In the next verse, he says, "Ye are all one in Christ Jesus."

The text (Eph. 2:8-9) includes the phrase, "that not of yourselves," which means that salvation is not of ourselves—we do not save or pardon our own sins, neither do we pay for salvation—"it is the gift of God."
