

This only made Jonah angry for he had looked forward to the destruction of Ninevah. Obviously, he did not really understand the purpose of

Hosea did, however, and along with the other two named above we find still a third theme in hi book: God desires repentance so that he may forgive, not de-stroy, his children! To be sure, there is much gloomy prophecy in Hosea.

Yet, along with the image of the Mighty Judge of the Universe, there is also a picture of a compassionate God who, although h abhors the sinfulness of his people, wants their repentance, not their punishment. Hosea pictures God as crying out: "How can I give you up, O Ephraim! (another name for the nation of Israel), How can I hand you over, O Israel!" (11:8a). So great is his love for Israel that it surpasses the monstrous evil of this people: "My heart recoils within me, my-compassion grows warm and tender" (11:8c). The real purpose of the prophe cies, then, are to call the people to acknowledge their rebellion and seek God's forgivness. "Come, let us return to the Lord; for he has torn that he may hea us" (6:1), says the prophet Hosea
