

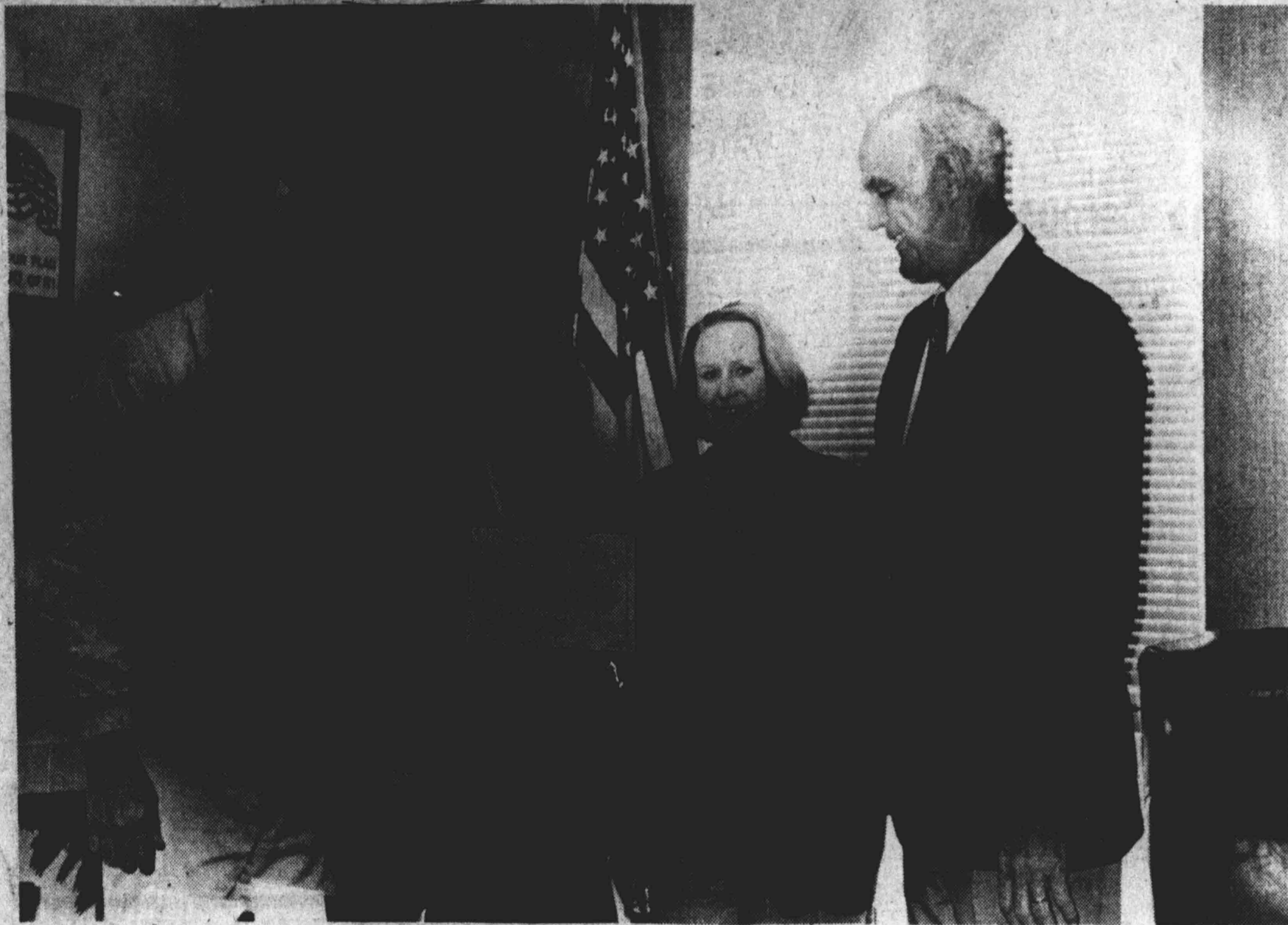

## Mourned



**ROSS W. DYER**, 81, Halls attorney and former chief justice of the state Supreme Court, died at 4 p.m. Sunday in his home at 205 S. College, Halls, after long illness with artery problems.

Services were at 2 p.m. Tuesday in First United Methodist Church in Halls, whose Men's Bible Class he taught for 40 years. Burial was in Halls Cemetery, Halls Funeral Home in charge.

Born at Halls, March 10, 1911, son of the late Clarence and Zona Smith Dyer, he attended the University of Tennessee and Cumberland University and took his law degree from the Young Men's Christian Assn. Law School in Nashville in 1937.

His practice in Halls was interrupted by three years of service as a captain in administrative duties with the Army Medical Corps in World War II, including duty in Europe.

He was elected to the Limited Constitutional Convention of 1953 and represented Lauderdale, Crockett, and Dyer Counties in the state Senate in 1957, serving as Democratic floor leader.

He was executive assistant to Gov. Buford Ellington, who appointed him to the Supreme Court Sept. 8, 1961, succeeding John E. Swepston, retiring. He was elected in August, 1962, to complete Swepston's term, and in August, 1966, to a full term.

He leaves his wife, Agnes Moss Dyer, formerly of Gallatin, a son, Thomas R. Dyer, Memphis attorney; three sisters, Virginia Dyer, of Jacksonville, Fla., Mrs. Clarene Edwards, of Memphis, and Mrs. Margaret Smith, of Albany, Ga.; and two grandchildren.

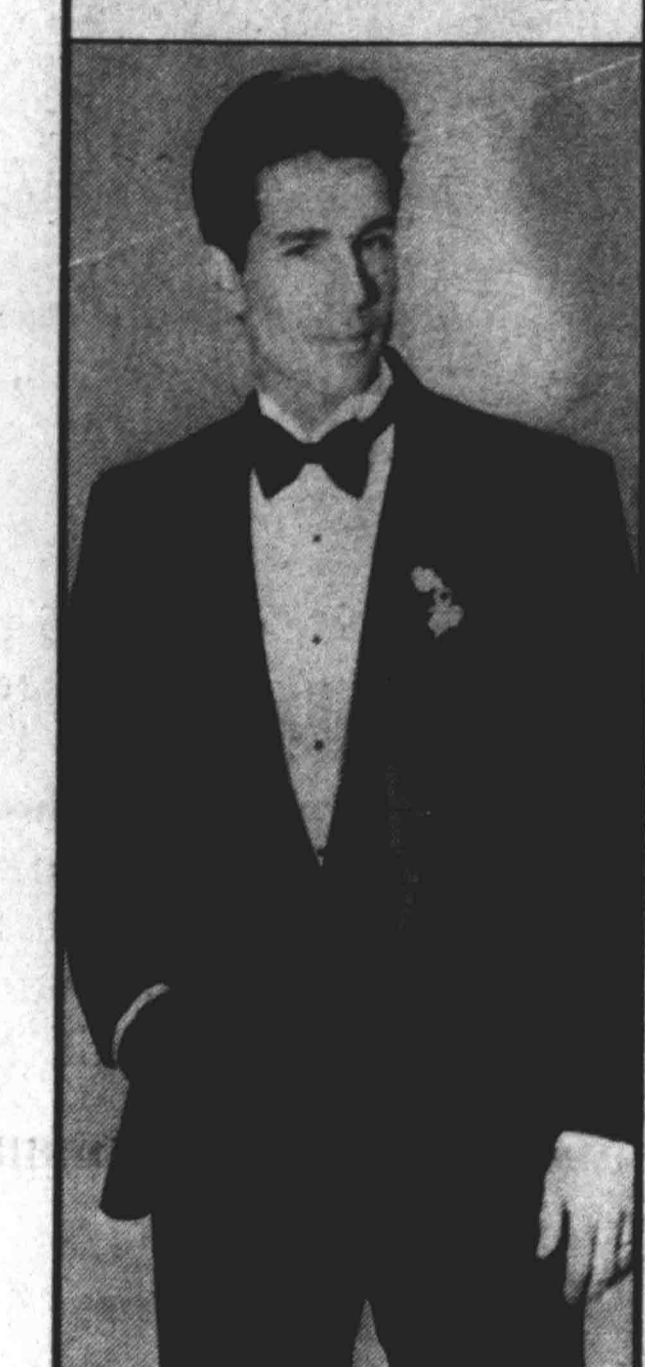

Section 2. **Building Permits.** It shall be unlawful to commence the excavation for or the construction of any building or other structure, including accessory structures to commence the moving (this includes mobile homes,) alteration or repair of any structure, including accessory structures or to commence the filling of land until the building inspector has issued for such work a building permit containing a statement that the plans, specifications and intended use of such structure in all respects conform with the provisions of this Resolution. Application for a building permit shall be made in writing to the building inspector on forms provided for that purpose. It shall be unlawful for the building inspector to approve the plans or issue a building permit for any excavation or construction until he has inspected such plans in detail and found them to be in conformity with this Resolution. To this end, the building permit for excavation, construction, moving (this includes mobile homes) or alteration shall be accompanied by a plan or plat drawn to a scale and showing the following in sufficient detail to enable the building inspector to ascertain whether the proposed excavation, construction, moving or alteration is in conformance with this Resolution:

- The actual shape, location and dimensions of the lot to be built upon.
- The shape, size and location of all buildings or other structures to be erected, altered or moved and of buildings or other structures already on the lot.
- The existing and intended use of all such buildings or other structures.
- Location and design of off-street parking areas and off-street location areas. Such other information concerning the lot or adjoining lots as may be essential for determining whether the provisions of this Resolution are being observed.

**Pharmacy Topics**

What spots breast cancer earlier than a mammogram? New tests at the University of California, San Francisco, may be able to identify women at high risk of developing the cancer years before. It analyzes breast fluid—removed painlessly—for abnormal cells. "Eating for two" is good advice when it comes to nursing mothers. New research at the Children's Nutrition Research Center in Houston suggests they should get about 100 grams of protein a day.

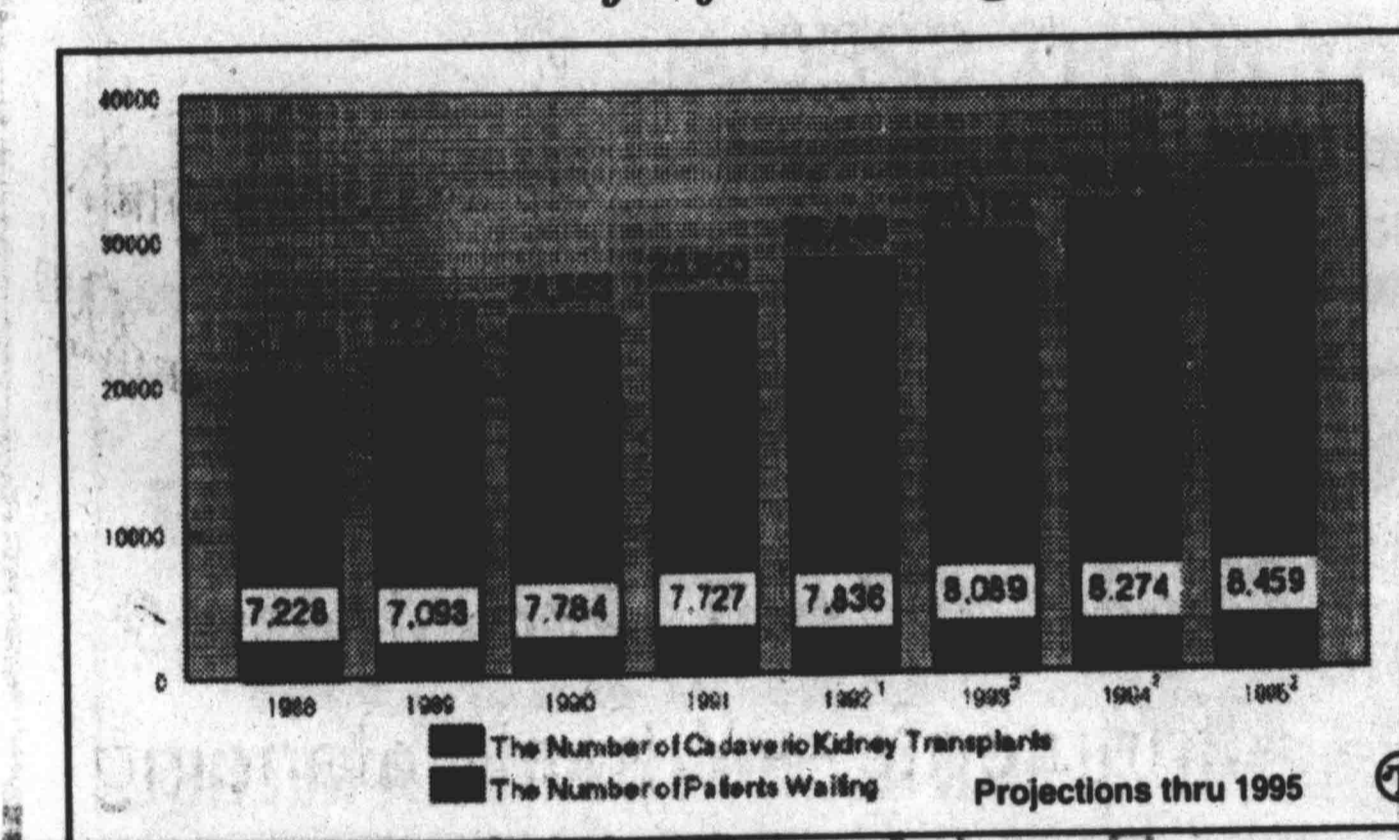
Strength-training workouts seem to speed the transit of food through the gut, say researchers at the University of Maryland.

Nasal nicotine spray can help smokers, even heavy smokers, quit, a test at the National Addiction Center at London University found.

New sensor, developed at Sandia National Laboratories and the University of New Mexico, can monitor glucose levels without pin-pricks or blood, using near-infrared light that can penetrate tissue. The device is said to be more accurate than current methods.

Washington, D.C., (NAPS)—Many Americans made a very special resolution recently. They resolved to save lives.

All you have to do to join them is to send for and fill out a free card that says you're a potential organ donor. The more medical science discovers about saving lives with organ transplants, the more the need for organ donors grows. Approximately every 20 minutes, someone in the U.S. is added to the transplant waiting list.

The cards can come from the United Network for Organ Sharing (UNOS), a non-profit organization that operates the nation's Organ Procurement and Transplantation Network. This network operates a 24-hour a day patient waiting list and an organ matching system coordinating the logistics of matching the organs, collecting, analyzing and publishing transplant data; and educating health professionals about the donation process.

Even if you sign a donor card, your family is asked for permission before any organs are removed.

Obtaining the card could be a great way to give the gift of a new beginning for someone else someday and perhaps in a sense for yourself as well.

"This is a really serious commitment to the library," Jackson says, "and we're really serious about taking advantage of it."

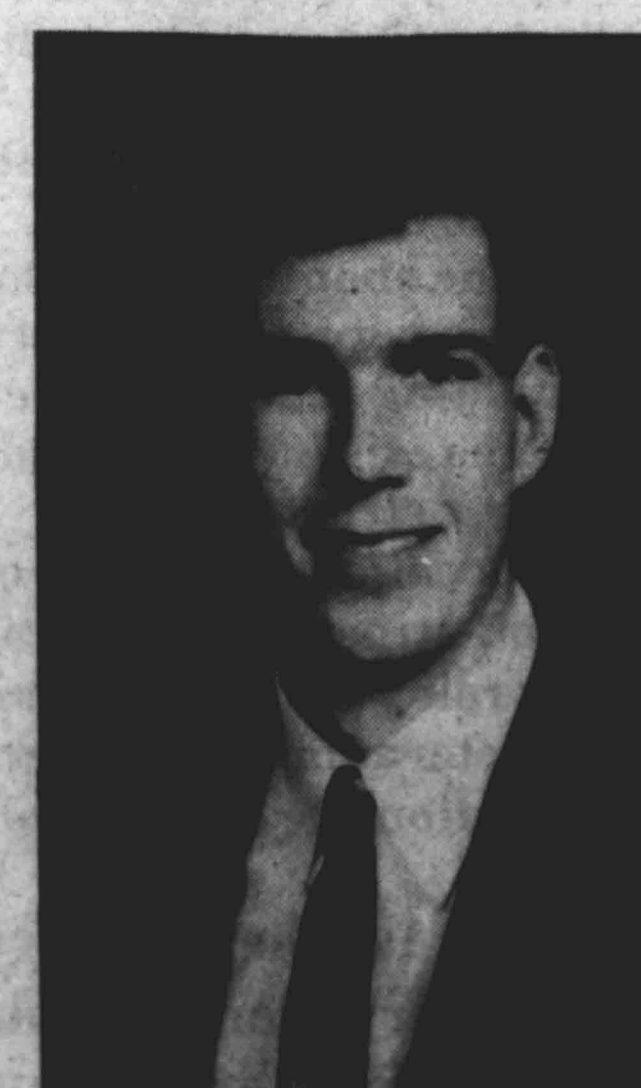

Tim's mother, Jerre, teaches English in RHS.

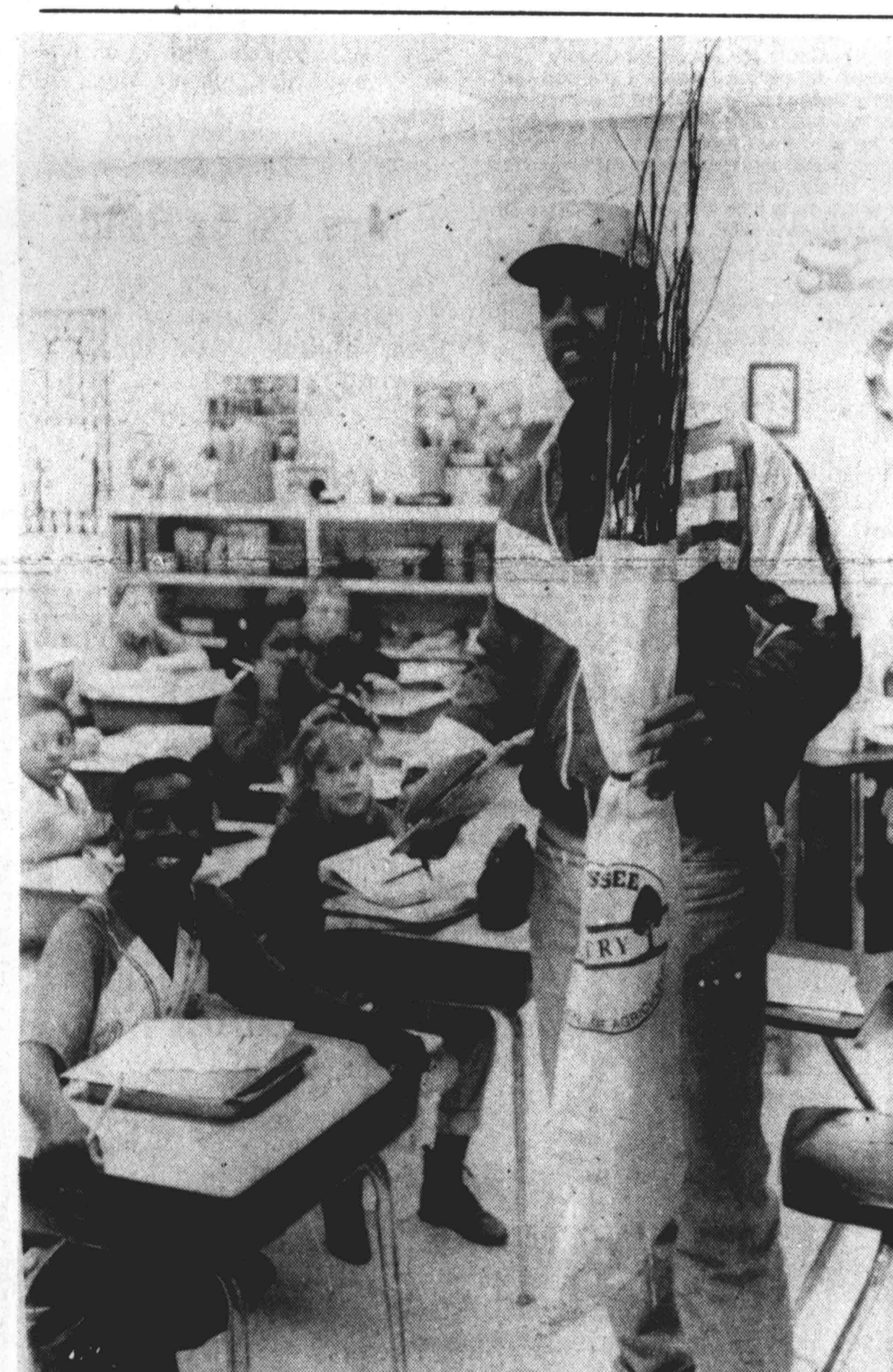

First there was Robocop. Now there's Roobodoc, an automation designed to provide a steady "hand" and computer-assisted knowhow to mill a precise cavity in a bone to accept a hip replacement. It may be used in other surgeries, too, say IBM and its collaborator companies.

How does aspirin work? Researchers at the University of California find it blocks communication between nerves and the spinal cord.

Early research into bulimia by the National Institute of Mental Health has linked the problem to excessive levels of a brain hormone, vasopressin. Next step, scientists say, is devising a medication.

Similarly, in tests at 13 medical centers, the antidepressant drug Prozac proved effective in reducing binge-and-purge behaviors. Side effects were mild.

The federal Centers for Disease Control has noted a rise in the occurrence of rubella-related birth defects in the children of women who were not vaccinated against German measles.

## Public Notice

Section 2. **Building Permits.** It shall be unlawful to commence the excavation for or the construction of any building or other structure, including accessory structures to commence the moving (this includes mobile homes), alteration or repair of any structure, including accessory structures or to commence the filling of land until the building inspector has issued for such work a building permit containing a statement that the plans, specifications and intended use of such structure in all respects conform with the provisions of this Resolution. Application for a building permit shall be made in writing to the building inspector on forms provided for that purpose. It shall be unlawful for the building inspector to approve the plans or issue a building permit for any excavation or construction until he has inspected such plans in detail and found them to be in conformity with this Resolution. To this end, the building permit for excavation, construction, moving (this includes mobile homes) or alteration shall be accompanied by a plan or plat drawn to a scale and showing the following in sufficient detail to enable the building inspector to ascertain whether the proposed excavation, construction, moving or alteration is in conformance with this Resolution:

A. The actual shape, location and dimensions of the lot to be built upon.

B. The shape, size and location of all buildings or other structures to be erected, altered or moved, and of buildings or other structures already on the lot.

C. The existing and intended use of all such buildings or other structures.

D. Location and design of off-street parking areas and off-street location areas. Such other information concerning the lot or adjoining lots as may be essential for determining whether the provisions of this Resolution are being observed.

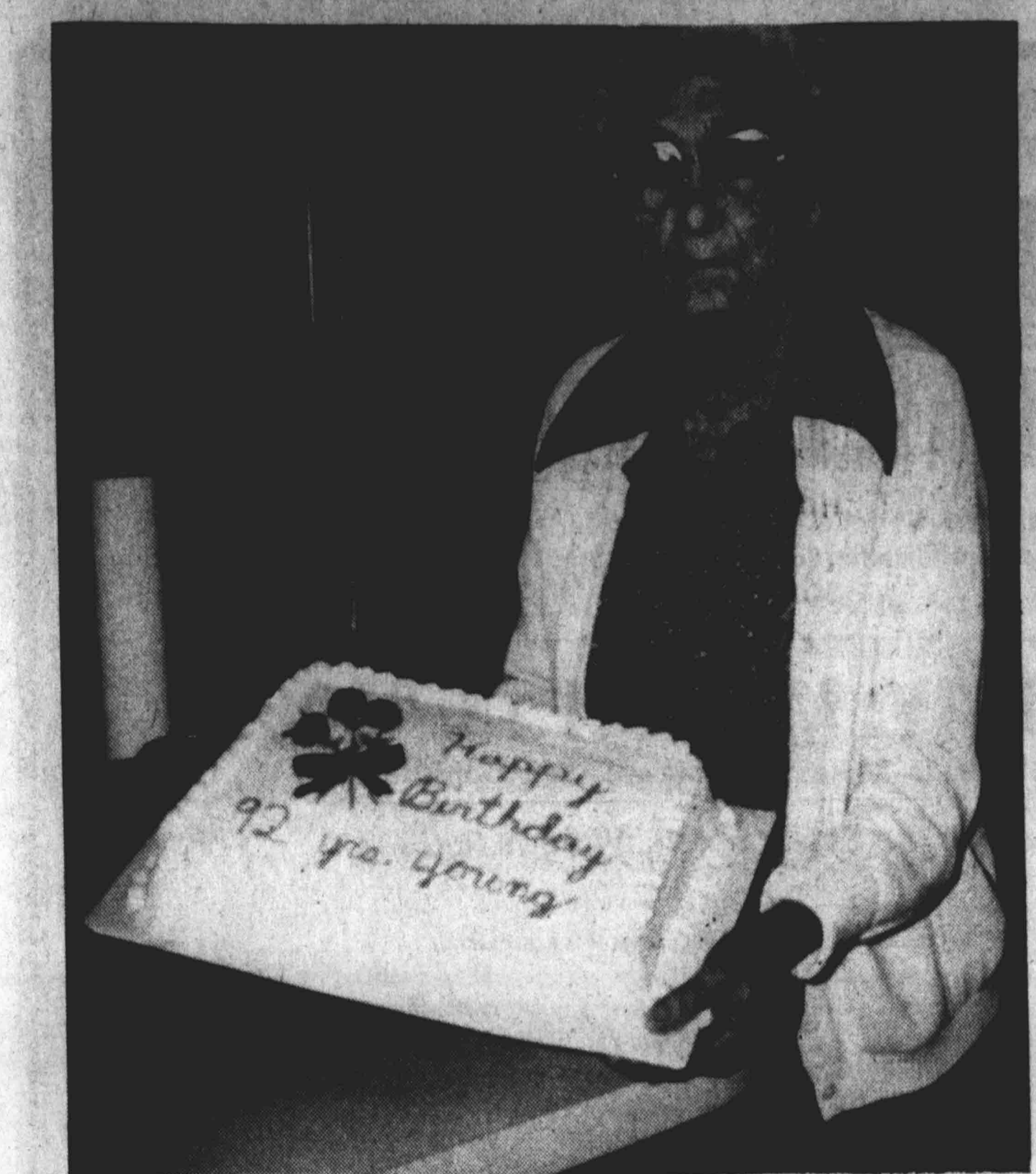

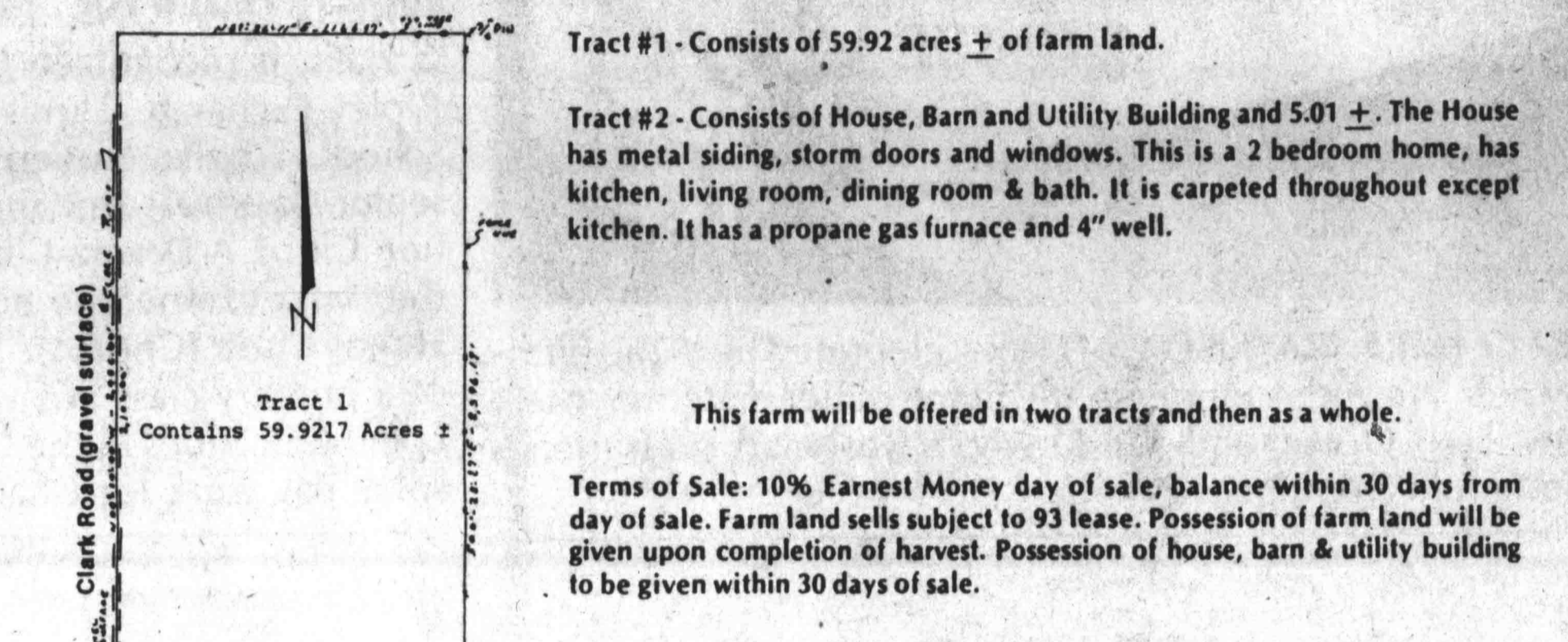

**Out-Of-Town Mailings Leaving Ripley Earlier**

Mailers at or through the Ripley Post Office are urged by Anita Graves, Postmaster, to note new schedules. Previously, mail to out-of-town addresses, received at the Ripley Post Office after 5:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday, left for the regional distribution center in Memphis at 6 p.m. next day.

Now, a truck of mail is also leaving the Ripley Post Office at 1:45 p.m. Monday through Friday (the 6 p.m. truck still runs).

If your out-of-town mail is in the Ripley Post Office by 1:15 p.m. Monday through Friday, you gain five hours on getting your mail sorted in Memphis and (often) placed on earlier air mail flights to its destination.

Ripley mail to Ripley addresses will continue to be handled locally if posted after 5:30 p.m. and before local carriers leave the Post Office next day.

After carriers leave, mail for Ripley addresses goes on the 1:45 p.m. truck to Memphis, to return for next day's delivery.

"A Postal Service clerk can sort only about 800 letters an hour, Graves reports.

She says the automated equipment in Memphis can sort 16,000 letters per hour, saving about 3.2¢ per letter.

She couldn't say how much of that 3.2¢ per letter might be lost in sacking, loading, transporting, re-sacking, re-loading, re-transporting, and resorting back to where the mail began.

[With millions of pieces of mail being delivered daily, no one can be quite sure what costs what.

[The editor, however, is confident of two things:

[Postal Service people in this county go far beyond the call of duty to be helpful, when possible.

[And you can get better mail service by getting your mail into the Ripley Post Office by 1 p.m., Monday through Friday.]

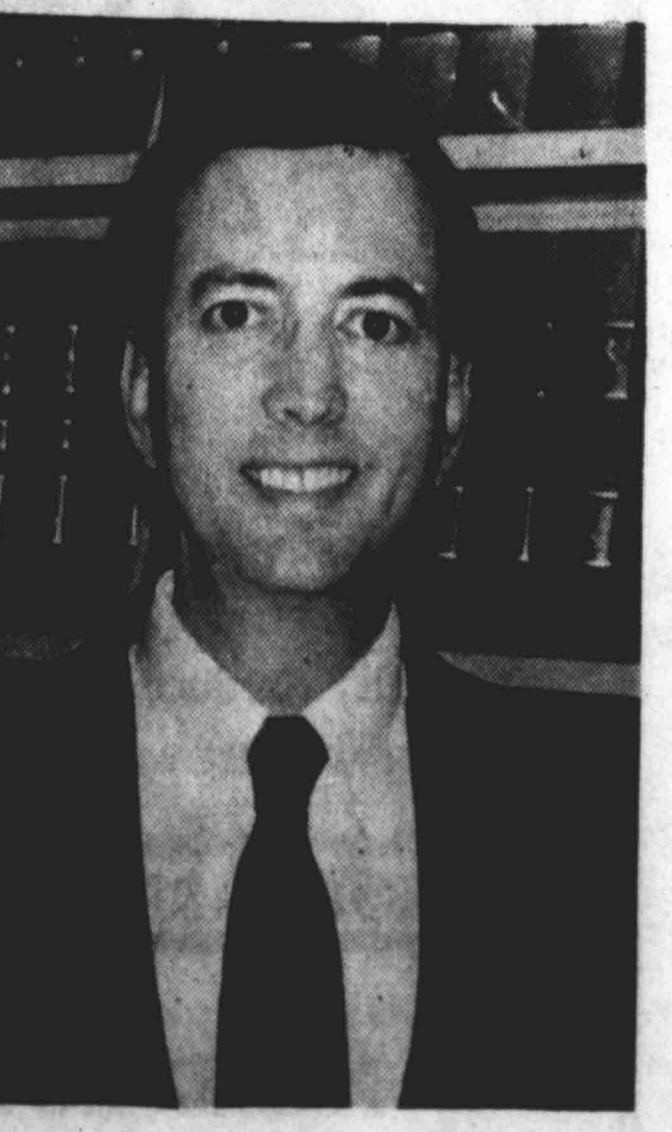

- The shape, size and location of all buildings or other structures to be erected, altered or moved and of buildings or other structures already on the lot.
- The existing and intended use of all such buildings or other structures.
- Location and design of off-street parking areas and off-street location areas. Such other information concerning the lot or adjoining lots as may be essential for determining whether the provisions of this Resolution are being observed.

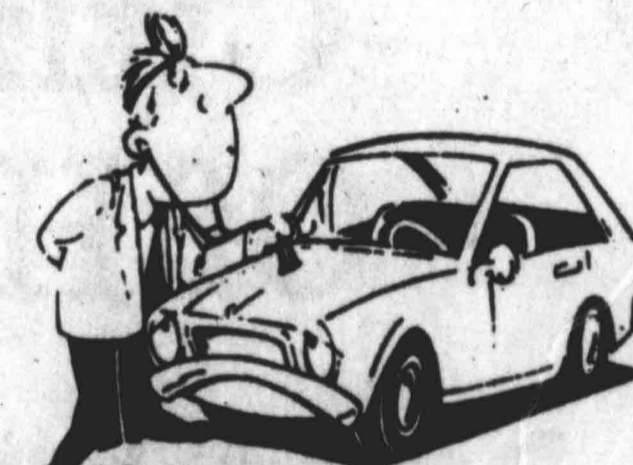

"The new Exchange Club Tina Turner Child Abuse Prevention Center is an example of what can be accomplished by working together toward any objective."

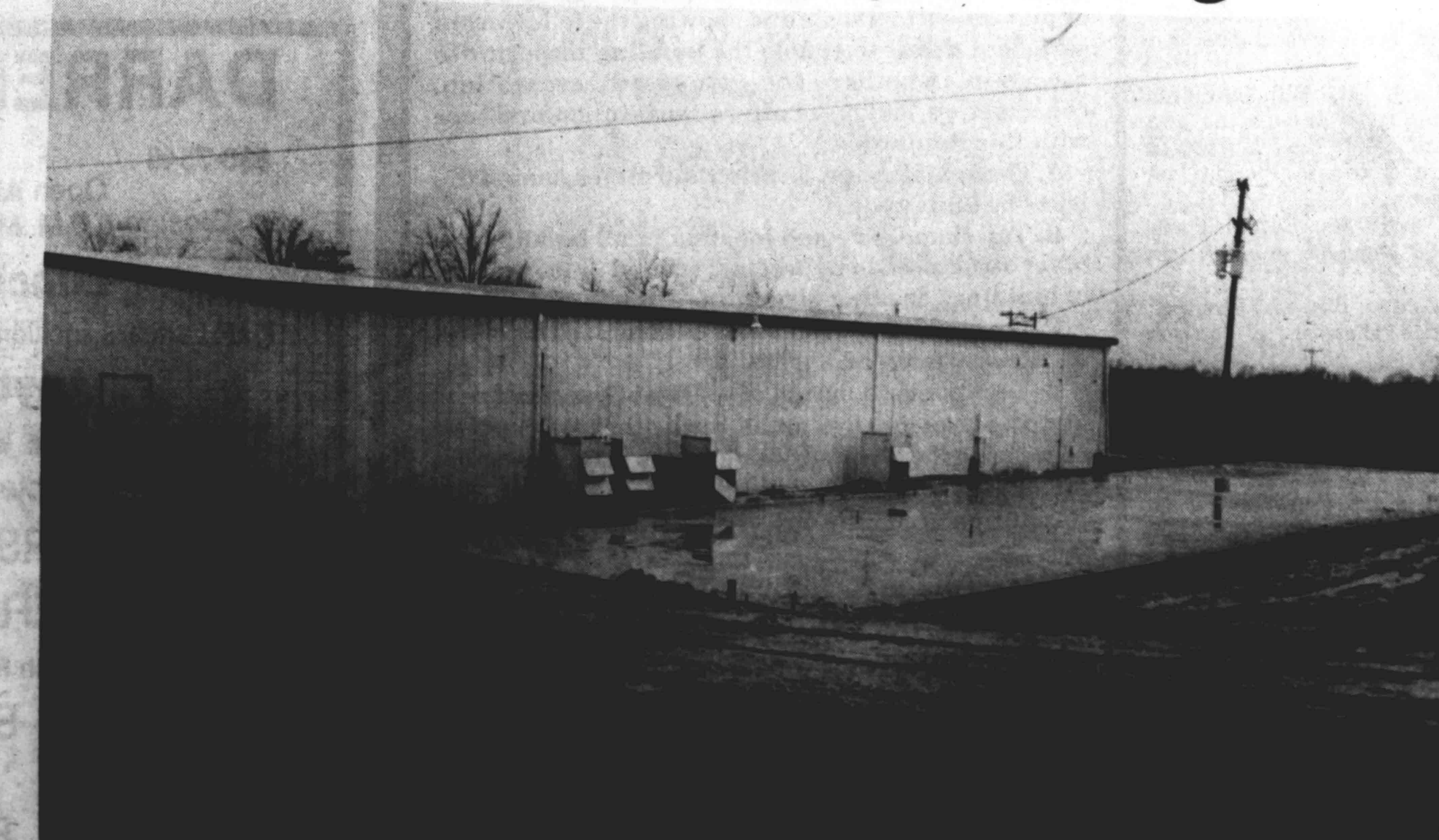

## Public Notice

- The actual shape, location and dimensions of the lot to be built upon.
- The shape, size and location of all buildings or other structures to be erected, altered or moved and of buildings or other structures already on the lot.
- The existing and intended use of all such buildings or other structures.
- Location and design of off-street parking areas and off-street location areas. Such other information concerning the lot or adjoining lots as may be essential for determining whether the provisions of this Resolution are being observed.
