

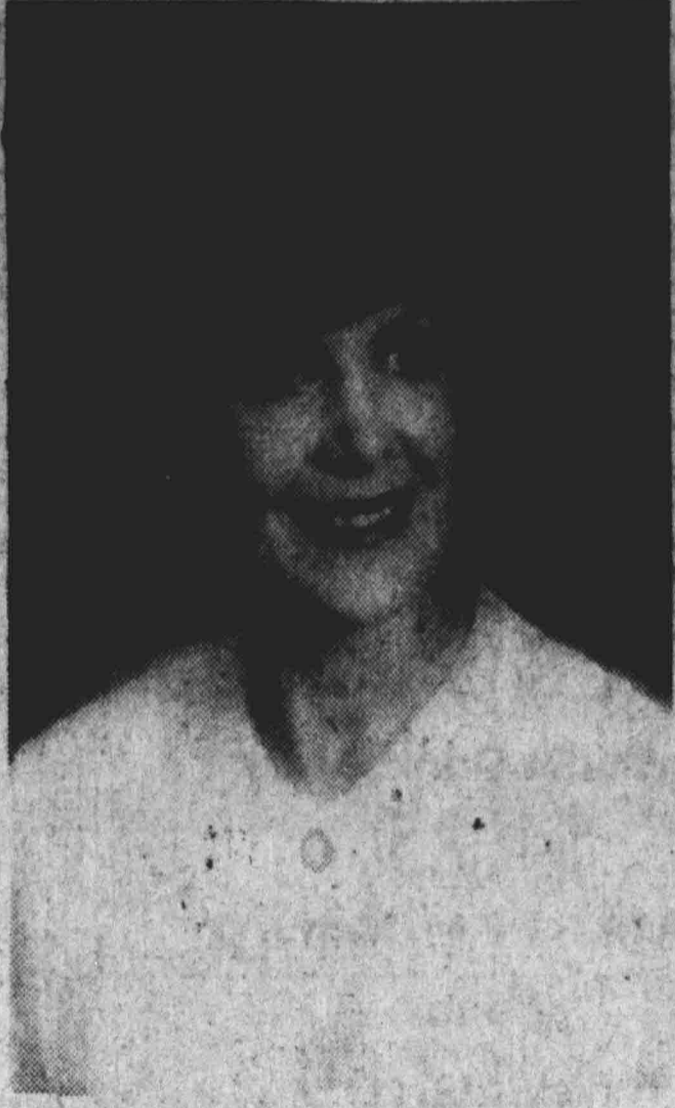

She comes to the bank from First Tennessee Bank, where she has been a mortgage loan officer.

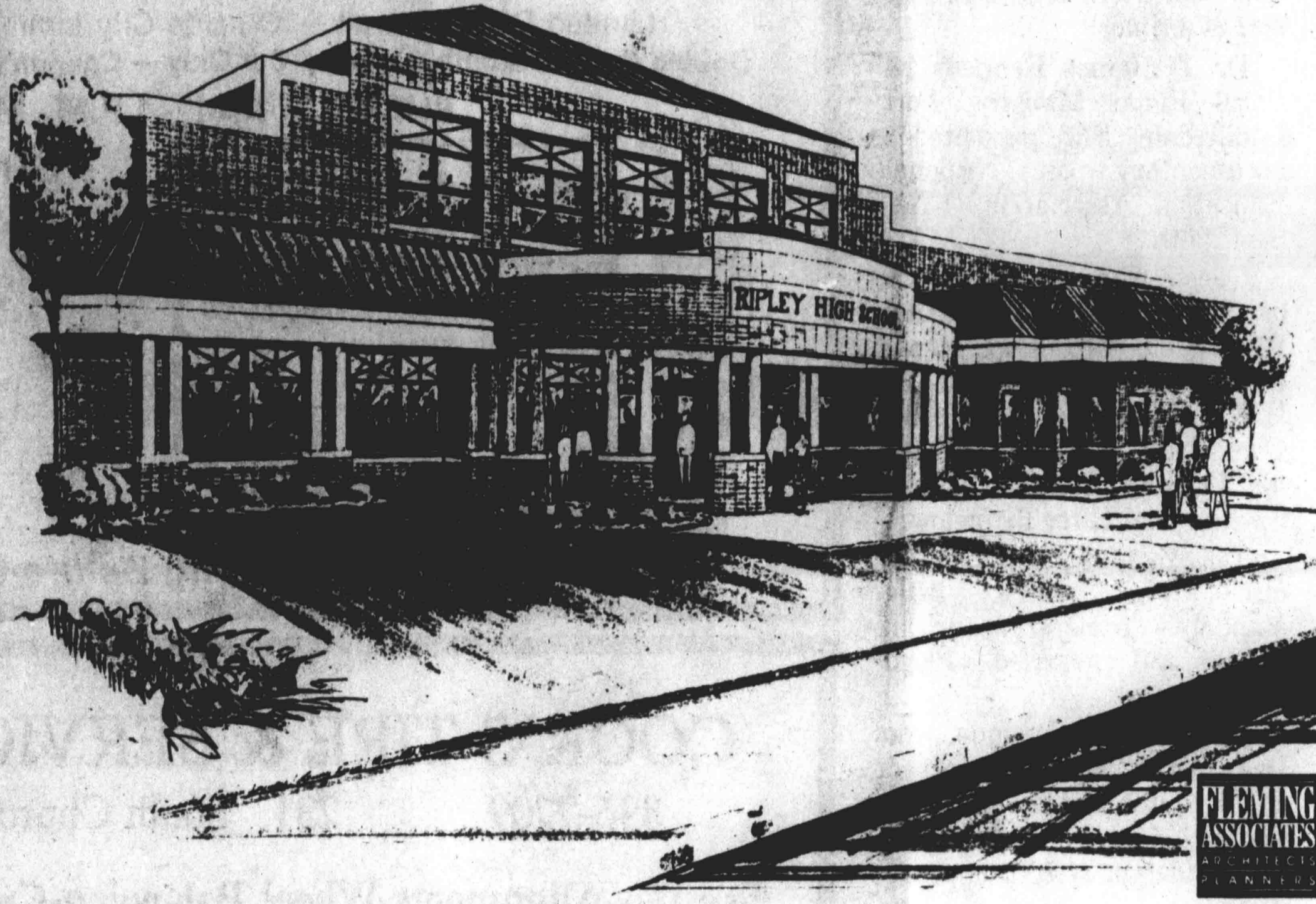
She previously spent 25 years with the Bank of Ripley, the final several years in the installment and mortgage loan department, as a loan officer and manager.

# Victorious Halls Visits Adamsville

A 54-20 romp over Middleton last week, during Home-Coming at Halls High School, propels the Halls Tigers, off their first win this season, into a visit to another Region 7-2A game in Adamsville, on a weekend which will likely decide one or more of the region's three play-off berths.

It's a clash of the titans, when runners-up in the region (2-2, over-all 3-2) will take on the region leaders.

McKenzie visits undefeated Milan, 3-0 in the region. Trenton hosts Huntingdon, also 3-0 in the region, but 4-1 overall.

When the dust settles, double upsets at the top could tie Adamsville, should it win from Halls, for second place in the region, 3-2.

That's a distant prospect for Adamsville, 1-8 last fall and moving up to Class AA this season. Barely, The Cardinals are 56th of 57 teams in Class 2A, on a 1992 enrollment of 357. Halls stands 36th, with 420.

Polled by Murphy Fair's pre-season "Tenn. High School Football," region coaches ranked Adamsville next to last, above Middleton (Middleton not responding to the poll).

Coaches ranked McKenzie just above Adamsville, and Halls just above McKenzie, for sixth place among nine teams.

Behold, half-way through the season, McKenzie holds a tie for second place. This weekend's play is expected to re-shuffle the deck, breaking some ties and sorting things out for the run to the wire for three state play-off berths. Results may be closer to poll predictions.

Halls visits McKenzie next week and closes its schedule in Milan, after hosting Westview and Riverside.

Adamsville lost its opener to McNairy, 10-0, and its next game to McKenzie, 14-6. Its wins then came from Riverside, 12-7, and Middleton, 35-0. Milan crushed it last week, 46-7.

Coches Danny Combs began the season with a near-record squad of 40, but young (only seven seniors), and short on speed. However, he had seven starters back on both sides of the ball.

Junior quarterback Chad Wyatt (5-8, 150) topped 600 yards last fall, with 42 tackles as free safety.

Junior tailback Jimmy Terry (5-8, 160) posted 995 yards and made 48 tackles at the corners.

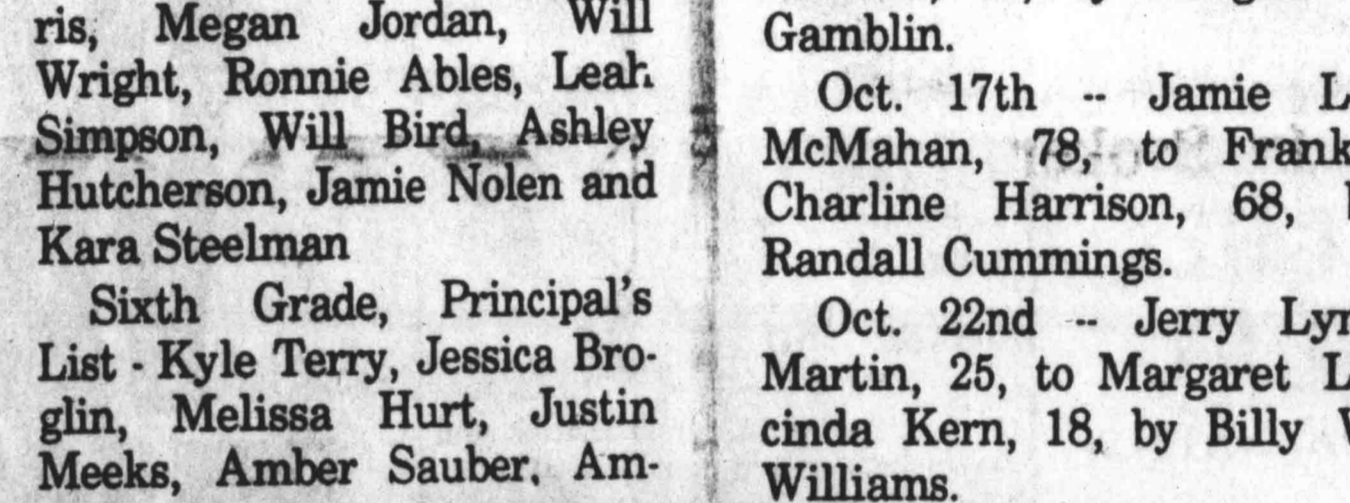

# Halls Region Season Rides Vs. Riverside

Halls High School's Tigers can keep their hopes for a 500 season in Region 7-2A alive with a win this Friday, on Halls turf, from Riverside.

Halls, trounced last week by Westview, 56-7, sank to 2-4 in region play. A win from Riverside, 1-5, would give the Tigers a (very long) shot at that .500 mark (4-4), with a win in Milan next week.

The odds are long. Milan and Huntingdon, 6-0 in the region, clash in Huntingdon this week; one will emerge 7-0, one 6-1. Westview, 5-1 on its win from Halls, seeks the region's third play-off berth in its remaining games with Trenton (2-4) and Huntingdon.

Riverside's 1992 enrollment (512) ranks it 11th of 57 teams in Class 2A. Halls (420) ranks 35th.

Riverside's Panthers were 3-7 last year, winning from Hickman County, Ky., 12-3, from Huntingdon, 22-16, and from Chester County, in over-time, 8-7.

They lost to Lewis County, 14-7, Jackson South Side, 20-8, Camden, 21-19, Hardin County, 13-7, Humboldt, 36-0, McNairy Central, 27-13, and Milan, 29-6.

Coach Steve Boggan had back this fall only eight letter-men and four seniors.

The Panthers have won this year from Trenton, 15-12, on a fourth quarter fumble the Tide lost to Panther junior Eric Quinn (5-11,165) on the Tide's 28.

Losses have been to Chester County, 20-6, Westview, 39-7, Adamsville, 12-7, Milan, 45-7, and Huntingdon, 48-0.

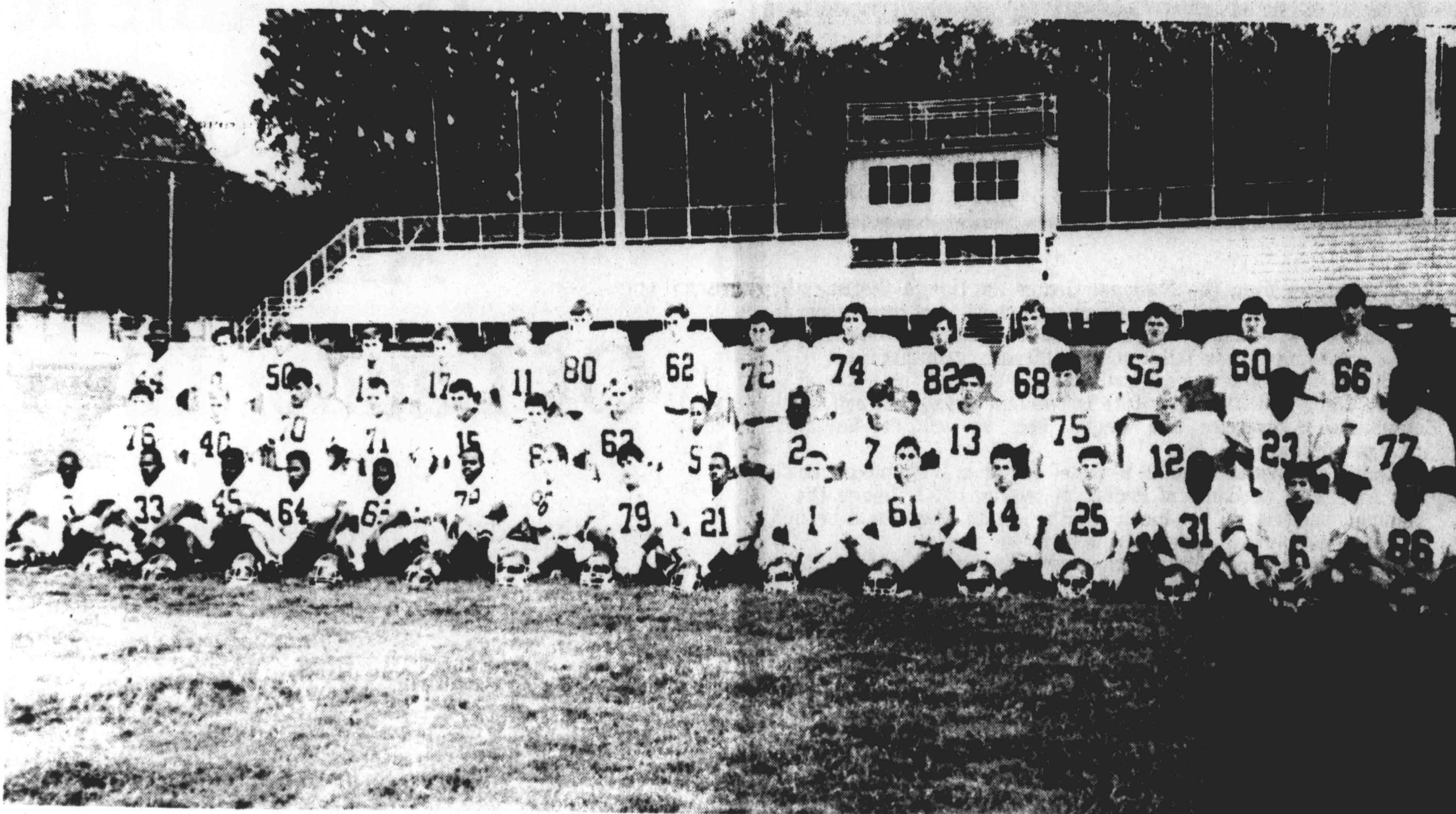
