
# Re-Elected

Smoking during pregnancy may lower the child's IQ by a few points, a study at Cornell University suggests. Children in the study will be followed in future years.

Scarabrasion, an outpatient procedure similar to dermabrasion, can sometimes make fresh scars disappear, says a plastic surgeon at the College of Physicians and Surgeons in New York. The procedure is most effective at about eight weeks after surgery or injury.

Combination regimen of calcium supplements and slow-release, low-dose sodium fluoride seemed to restore bones weakened by osteoporosis in a test at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center in Dallas. The eatment increased bone mass by 5 percent a year.
