Ripley, in District 14 of Region 7-AAA, will compete with Arlington (Bolton), Bartlett, Covington, Dyersburg, Memphis Craigmont, Millington, and Munford.

Two Ripley foes last fall--Bolivar and Haywood--will play in District 13 of Region 7-AAA, with Jackson Central Merry, Jackson North Side, Lexington, Savannah, and Fayette-Ware (Somerville).

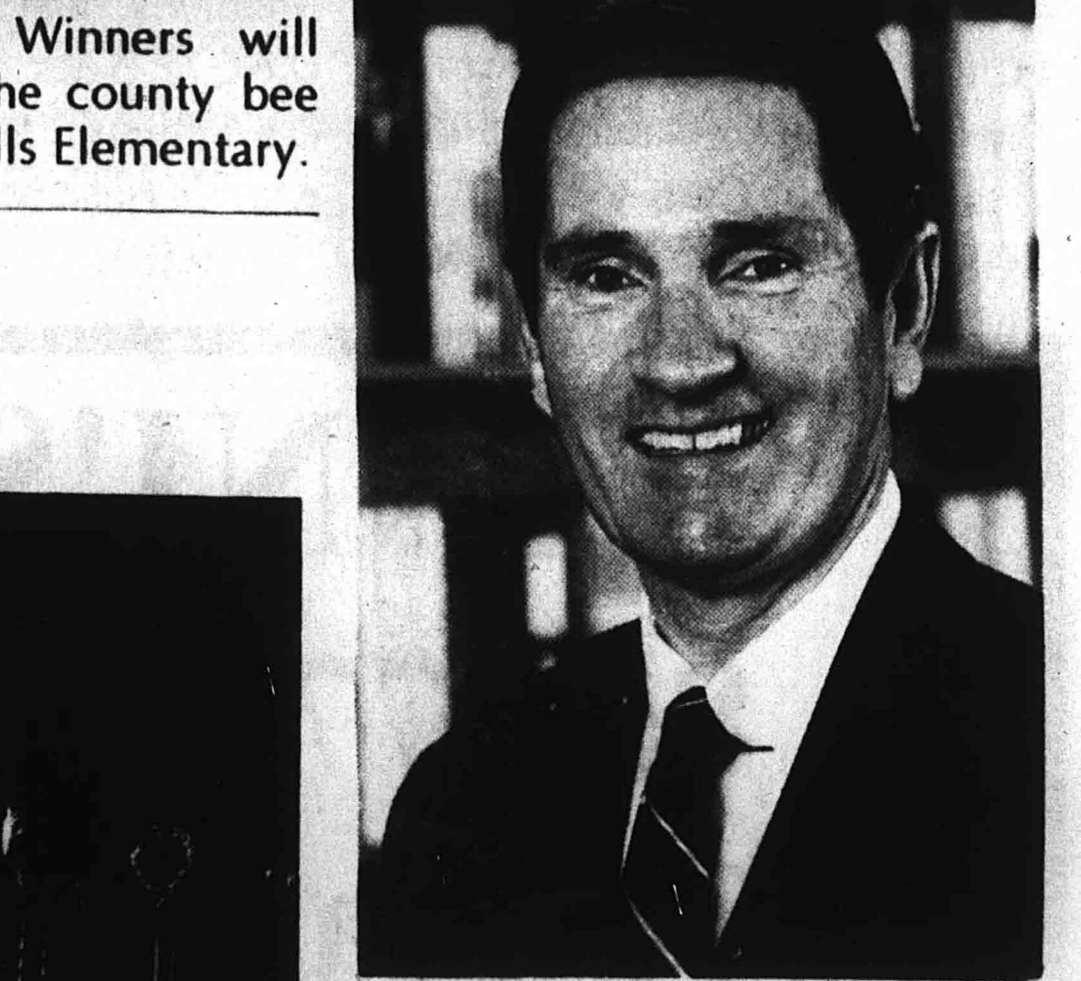

## Wife Of Doctor Struck By Car

No charges have been filed. The accident remains under investigation.



DR. E. GRADY BOGUE, brother of Mrs. Beth Escue, of Ripley, had his fifth book published last month. Leadership by Design focuses on strengthening integrity in higher education.

Dr. Bogue is chairman of the Department of Educational Leadership at the University of Tennessee and chancellor emeritus of Louisiana State University in Shreveport where he served as chancellor for ten years. He received his bachelor of science degree in mathematics, his masters in education and an Ed. D. degree in educational administration, from Memphis State University. He served as interim chancellor of Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College in 1989. From 1970 to 1980 he was associate director for the Tennessee Higher Education Commission. He held three different administrative appointments at Memphis State between 1964 and 1974, the last as assistant vice-president for academic affairs. He was named distinguished alumnus in 1986.

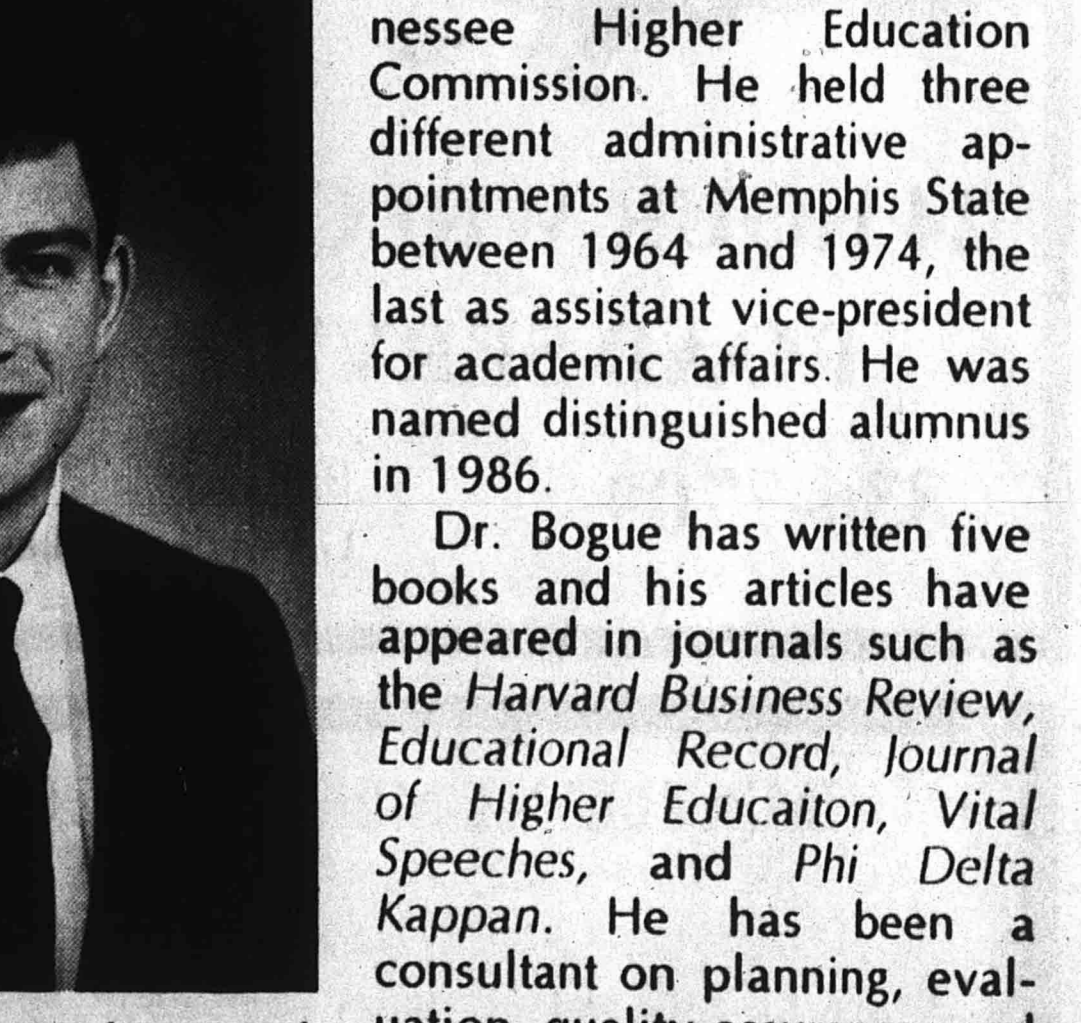
Dr. Bogue has written five books and his articles have appeared in journals such as the Harvard Business Review, Educational Record, Journal of Higher Education, Vital Speeches, and Phi Delta Kappan. He has been a consultant on planning, evaluation, quality assurance, and leadership to colleges and universities, state-level higher education agencies, and corporations. He was an American Council on Education (ACE) fellow in academic administration in 1974-1975 and served as visiting scholar with the Educational Testing Service in 1988-1989. During his ACE fellowship year and the following five years with the Tennessee Higher Education Commission, he was director of the Performance Funding Project, developing and implementing one of the first state-level performance incentive policies in American higher education. He has been a visiting lecturer in China and is adjunct member of the faculty at Northeast University in Shenyang, China.

This program provides one-time assistance to help with the utility cost for heating the home of the low income, elderly, and handicapped households in the county. A total of 640 households applied for assistance. Ripley Power and Light received \$25,416, Henning Gas and Water Department received \$2,520, Forked Deer Electric received \$3,088, Ripley Gas and Water received \$25,872, and Halls Gas and Water received \$12,136. About 30 households received direct payments.  
The agency also operated programs to assist eligible clients with emergency food and shelter, child care broker services, rent, utilities, transportation, summer food service, weatherization, and the owner occupied housing rehabilitation assistance.

**Ripley's Football Region Adjusted**

The Tenn. Secondary School Athletic Assn. has granted a request by Memphis Craigmont to be shifted from football Region 7-4A, in which Ripley High School will play this year, to Region 8-4A, with seven other Shelby County schools.

The TSSAA denied a request by Memphis University School to leave 8-4A for 7-4A.

These decisions leave Ripley with only five region foes in football this fall and the year after -- Arlington (Bolton), Collierville, Covington, Dyersburg, and Fayette-Ware (Somerville).

Craigmont remains in Ripley's District 14 of Region 7-AAA for 1995-96 and 1996-97 basketball, baseball, and softball, along with Arlington (Bolton), Bartlett, Covington, Dyersburg, Millington, and Munford.

**Nat'l Expert To Study County's Job Outlook**

Lauderdale County is one of six counties in Tennessee chosen by the state Department of Economic and Community Development for a free economic analysis, County Executive Rozelle Cramer reports.

The study will be conducted by J. Michael Mullis, president of J. M. Mullis, Inc.
