County's Area Code Named By BellSouth

BellSouth officials have announced that most West Tennessee counties will receive the new area code 731, beginning Feb. 12th next year, and becoming permanent Sept. 17th.

Shelby, Tipton and Fayette counties will continue to have the 901 area code.

Counties receiving the new 731

area code will include Lauderdale, Haywood, Hardeman, McNairy, Hardin, Decatur, Chester, Madison, Henderson, Crockett, Gibson, Dyer, Carroll, Benton, Henry,

Weakley, Obion and Lake. The code change will not affect the cost of telephone calls, and local calls will remain local, regardless of the area code dialed.

Businesses should begin making plans to reprogram any necessary equipment, such as PBX systems, fax machines, speed calling lists, pagers/beepers, voice mail services, modems, automatic dialers, cellular/PCS telephones and burglar alarms/security systems.

Printed materials, such as stationery, labels, business cards, invoices, checks, company directories, internal records and product packaging, will need to be updated.

The North American Numbering Plan Administration (NANPA) oversees the assignment of area codes, as a third-party administrator. The FCC selected NeuStar, Inc., as the NANPA.

The new area code was added to accommodate the growth and competition in telecommunications, stemming from additional telephone lines, fax machines, pagers, cellular service and modems for personal computers.

Funds Voted For I-69, Dyersburg-Millington

The U.S. Congress has approved a U.S. Department of Transportation budget for the fiscal year which began Oct. 1st, including \$18,400,000 for environmental, survey, and design work on a new Interstate Highway 69 from Dyersburg, through Lauderdale County, to Millington.

The House vote was 344-50, the Senate vote 78-10.

The projected 1,430-mile 1-69 from Port Huron, Mich., to the Mexican border has been completed to Indianapolis, Ind.

Segments to Fulton, Ky., and from Fulton to Dyersburg are in various stages of preparation.

Spiller Suspended By The route is expected, in this County Commission

William Spiller, Jr. Accused With Counts Of Misconduct

William "Billy" Spiller, Jr., Lauderdale County Highway Commissioner, was indicted by the October term of Circuit Court last week on nine counts of official misconduct.

Agents filed a search warrant seeking road materials, bridge materials, crushed rock, equipment, supplies, and Lauderdale County road equipment on Spiller's property at 5572 Old Brownsville Road, Ripley. The warrant was executed by Tennessee Bureau of Investigation agent Roger Turner. A double-blade axe head inscribed with "L.C.H.D." was found at the property and all other items recovered were photographed and left at the scene by Turner.

Six employees testified that Spiller had them working for him on his property, repairing farm equipment, delivering road and bridge materials, and building a tool shed on his property using county equipment and materials during regular working hours or performing personal repairs on items at the county shop during regular hours.

The court document states that during October 1, 1998 and October 1, 2000, pursuant to a common scheme or plan in Lauderdale County, Tennessee and before the finding of the indictment, William Spiller, Jr., did unlawfully, feloniously, and knowingly use Lauderdale County Highway Department employees to obtain personal benefits by use of his position as a Lauderdale County Highway Commissioner, which constitutes an unauthorized exercise of his official power in violation of T.C.A. 39-16-402

In count two, Spiller is charged with using materials belonging to eradic the highway department. In counts erty. three to nine, Spiller is charged with having an employee report to work on his day off and load and stating deliver bridge materials to his personal residence, having employees year puse the county dump truck and deliver, in two separate incidences, 2001.

five loads of dirt and more than 34 loads of dirt to his personal residence, having an employee change the transmission fluid in his personal vehicle with county tools during regular hours in the county shop, having employees clean the carport at his residence, having an employee wash and clean the personal vehicle of Spiller's son during regular hours on county property, and having employees spray Roundup during regular hours to eradicate weeds on Spiller's property.

Elizabeth T. Rice, Attorney General, signed the indictments stating these violations and similar ones have occurred within a two year period prior to 1999. A trial date has been set for February 8, 2001.
