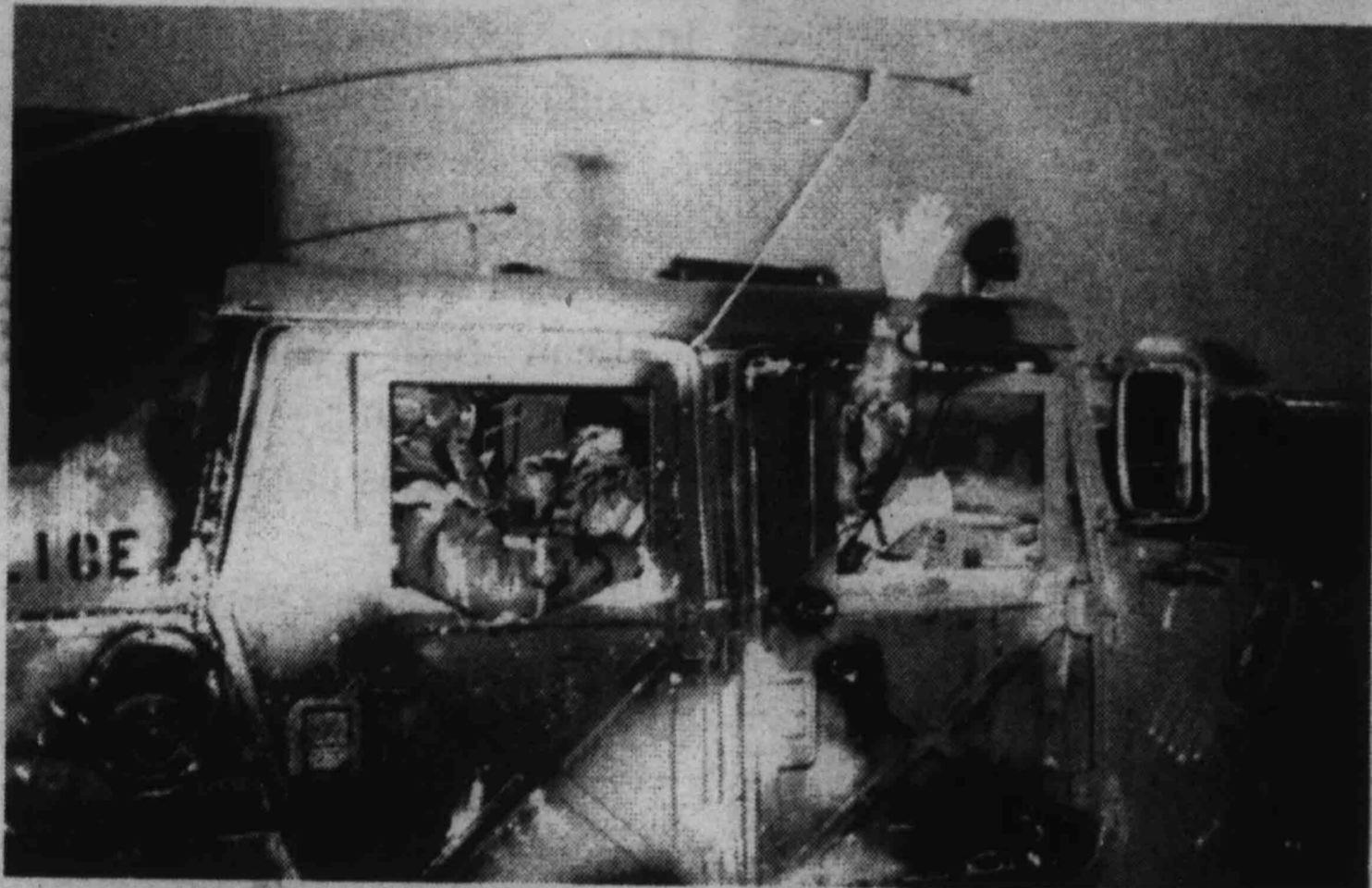

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268th Departs



LAUDERDALE COUNTIANS gathered, despite the cold and torrential rain, Thursday of last week to say good-bye to Ripley's 268th Military Police Company of the National Guard as they left for Ft. Knox, Ky. About 80 members of the unit, who were called to active duty, will receive "refresher training" before being assigned to "augment existing security forces at federal facilities."

They are the only National Guardsmen from Tennessee on active duty, for up to a year, in response to the World Trade Center disaster.

According to Randy Harris, Director of Public Affairs, the unit arrived at Ft. Knox Friday morning without any problems, with the traffic or rain, and that the men and women were doing fine.

After the unit leaves Ft. Knox, they will be deployed to an undisclosed location or locations, therefore in an effort to support the troops, *The Lauderdale County Enterprise* will provide a drop site for cards and letters to the service

persons. If anyone (friends, family members, or concerned citizens) wishes to send a Christmas greeting or a card of support, to any service personnel, bring or mail the card to *The Enterprise* office, P.O. Box 289, 145 E. Jackson, Ripley. Address the cards or letters to "Any Soldier" or your family member and we will forward the cards and letters to Nashville, who will distribute the mail to the recipients.

To ensure the safety of our service men and women, cards and letters should have a return address clearly hand written or typed. No perishables, please. A postcard is preferred. All mail should be in our office by noon Dec. 14th.

Record Crops Dump Prices

The best yields County Extension Leader "Jerry" Parker has seen in 25 years in this county are dropping market prices to make it another tough year for farmers.

Of about \$50,000,000 a year in farm income in the county, cotton still makes nearly 40%.

Parker's and state estimates:

Cotton, 56,000 acres in this county, 750 lbs. per acre; state, 600 lbs.

Corn, 15,000 acres, 140 bushels per acre; state, 133, 19 bushels above last year.

Soy Beans, 65,000 acres

here, 25 bushels; state, up 28%.

Wheat, 12,000 acres here, yield estimated 55-60 bushels.

Public Library In Halls Is A Bargain

Halls Public Library, 110 N. Church Street, is in the business of gathering and disseminating information and providing for educational and recreational needs of people in Lauderdale County.

During the year, from July 2000 through June 2001, library patrons borrowed 7,651 hard-bound books, 2,614 paperbacks, 990 video cassettes and 248 audio cassettes. 409 reference questions were answered and 210 magazines were circulated.

Bookmobile stations circulated 15,673 books to patrons throughout the country.

Nineteen inter-library loans were secured for books that could not be purchased at any price.

Other services impossible to evaluate include the Library meeting room used by groups and individuals, genealogical and historical records, tours and class field trips, and last, but not least, capable, efficient assistance from the Forked Deer Regional Library and inter-library loan service for the Area Resource Center.

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Army's Air Assault Visits



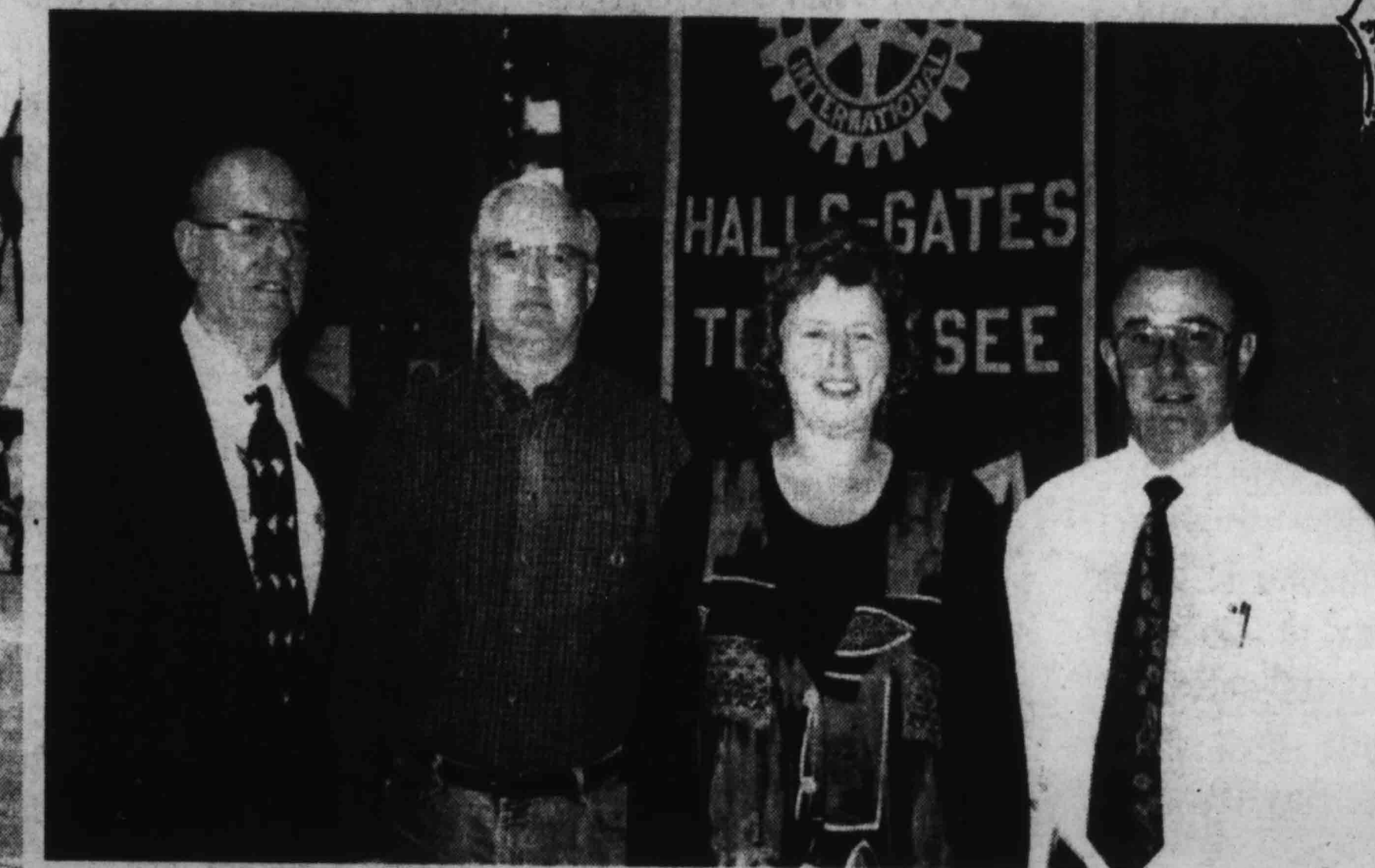

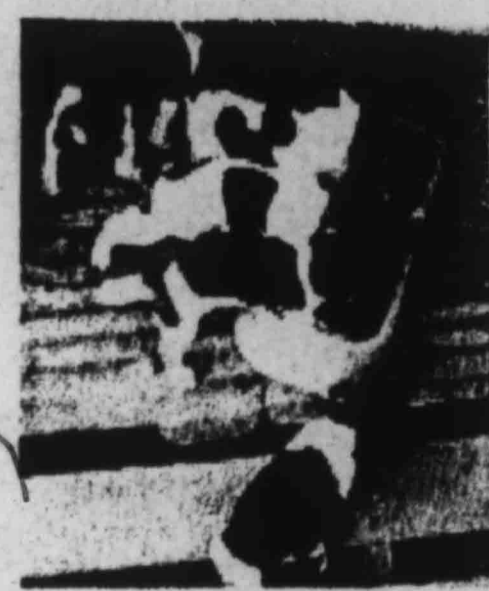

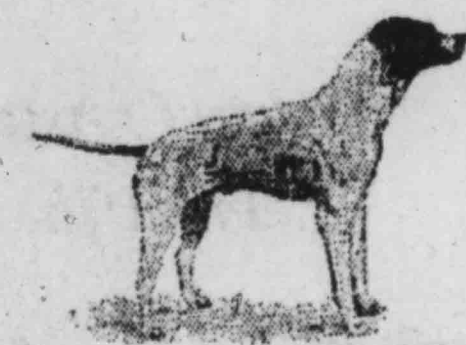

CHRISTMAS COLORS

The following is reprinted from a newsletter of the First United Methodist Church in Ripley.

Late one Christmas Eve, I sank back tired, but content, into my easy chair. The kids were in bed, the gifts were wrapped, the milk and cookies waited by the fireplace for Santa. As I leaned back admiring the tree, I couldn't help feeling that something important was missing.

It wasn't long before the tiny twinkling lights lulled me to sleep. After a while, I opened my eyes, and to my surprise I saw Santa Claus himself standing by the tree. HHS Students Pass Gateway Test



HALLS HIGH SCHOOL students of Renee Harber, biology teacher, in upper photo, and Teressa Mills and Mindi Hern, Algebra I teachers, passed the required Gateway test. The 28 Algebra I students taking the test passed with an average of 46.5% correct of 62. Three students were ranked proficient and 25 ranked advanced. Biology

students were 42.19% of 62 correct with three ranked proficient and 33 advanced. A passing grade is required for graduation in the State of Tennessee for all high school students. Math Foundations 2 test, not required for graduation, but the grade counts as 25% of the students final grade saw 31 of the 34 students with a passing grade.

HEPATITIS A

Over the last three months, the Memphis and Shelby County Health Department has reported a community outbreak of Hepatitis A, a disease commonly found in underdeveloped countries and areas where environmental sanitation is poor.

Hepatitis means inflamma-

tion of the liver, and type "A" designates which virus is causing the illness. It is spread by fecal and oral contamination of objects, such as toys.

The virus is not spread through air or saliva, or being in the same room with an infected person. It can spread easily under crowded living conditions, such as large families or day

care centers if good handwashing practices are not used.

Although not life threatening, the illness can produce severe symptoms, such as nausea, vomiting and jaundice (yellowing of the eyes and skin) two to six weeks after exposure, and possibly lead to hospitalization or days absent from work or school.

Education on the importance of practicing proper handwashing is key to stopping the spread of the disease, and in most cases, can be prevented through the simple practice of washing hands with soap and water for a minimum of twenty seconds to lift germs off the skin, allowing them to be rinsed away.

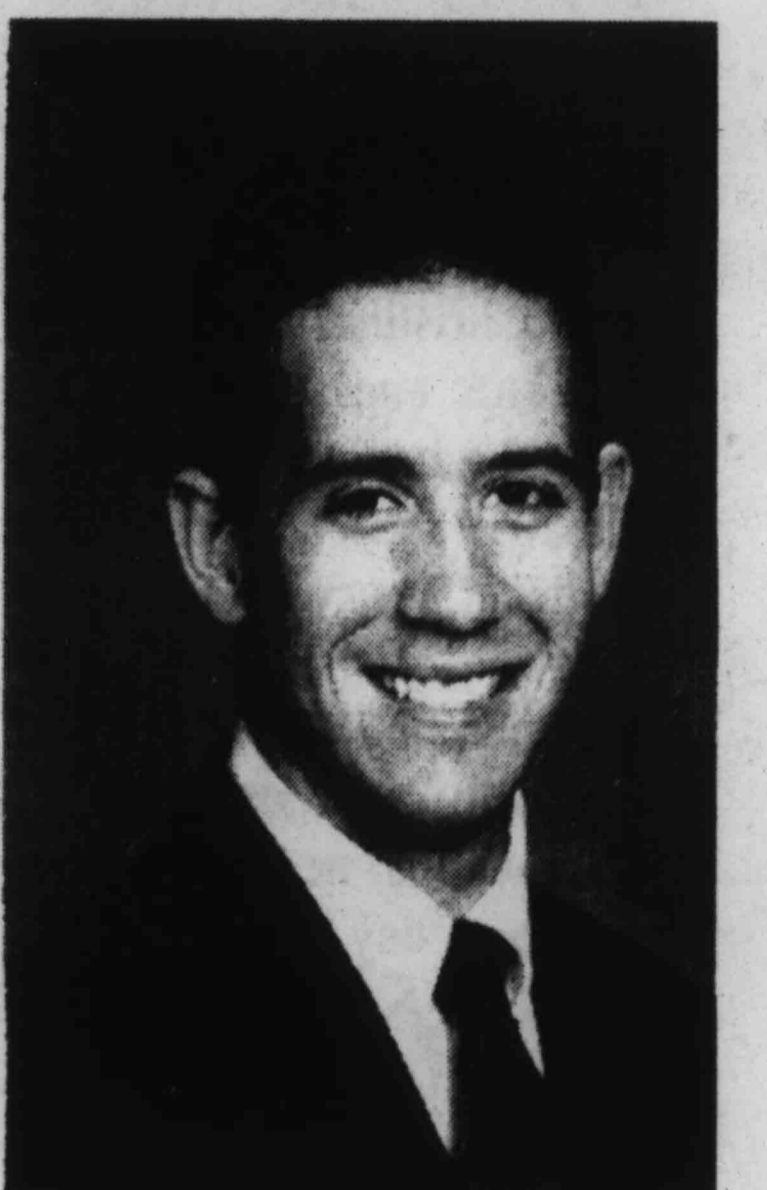

Ft. Pillow's Annex Eyed For Doubling

State plans to expand prisons include a proposed doubling of the 150 beds in the Fort Pillow State Penitentiary Annex.

Steve Hays, of the state Department of Corrections, says other expansion of the Fort Pillow prison complex, now housing about 2,580 of near 17,500 state prisoners (not counting some 2,000 in county jails) isn't likely.

"The buildings are too old, require too much maintenance, and are too staff-intensive to supervise."

The complex, begun in the 1930s as the Fort Pillow State Farm, includes a high security facility, the basic prison, and the minimum security annex.

The state will need 500 new prison beds by late spring, Gov. Don Sundquist says, and another 2,200 in 2005.

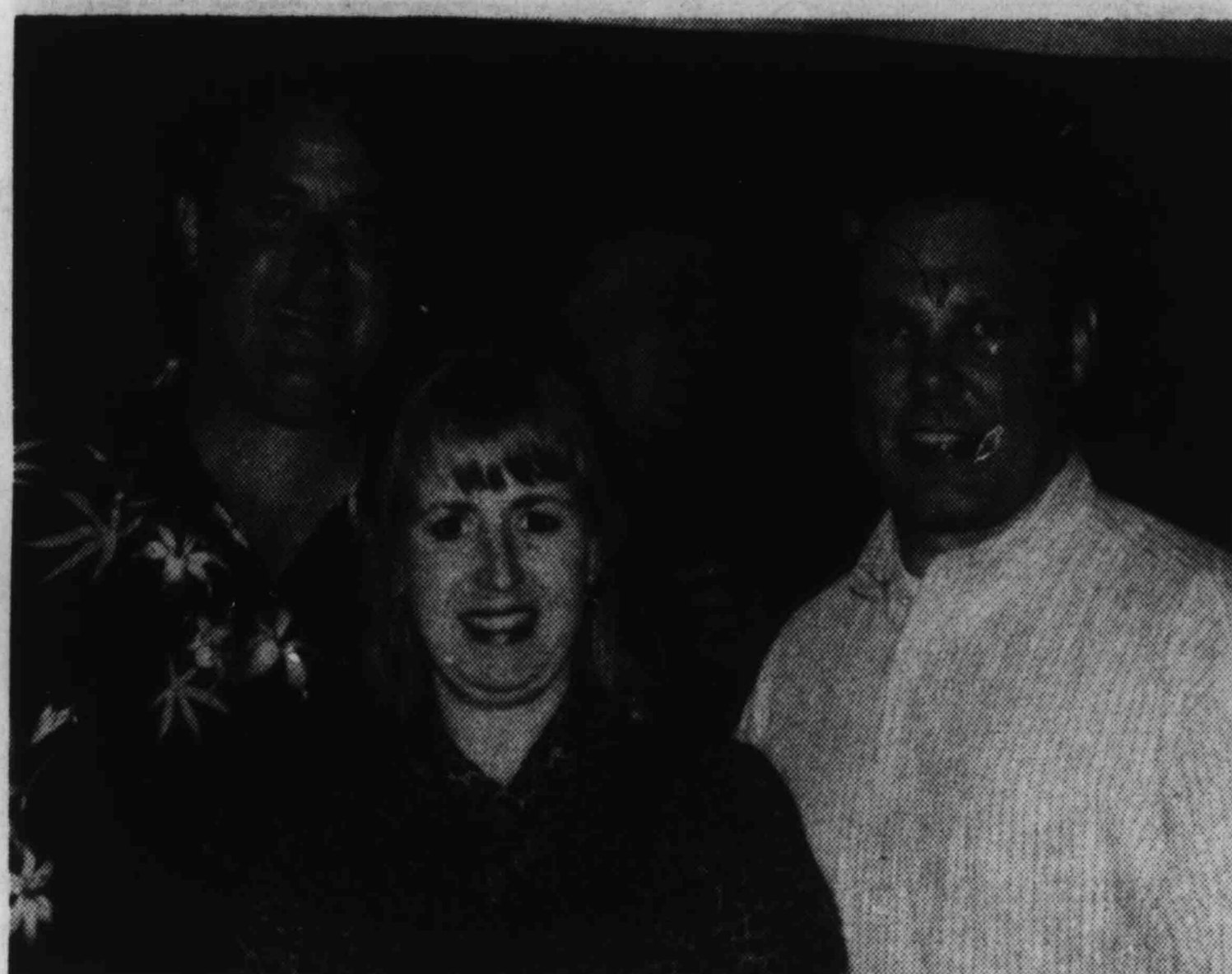

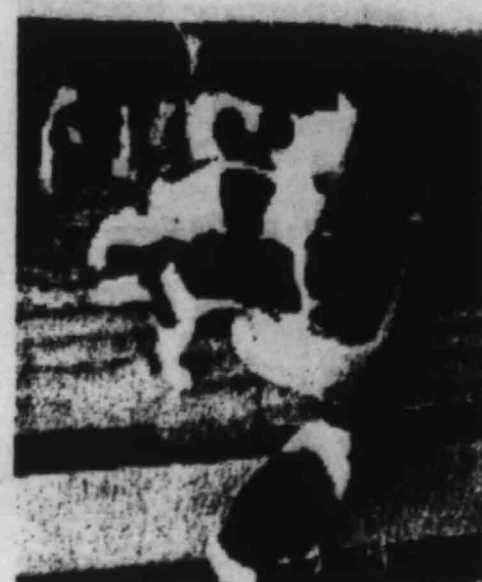

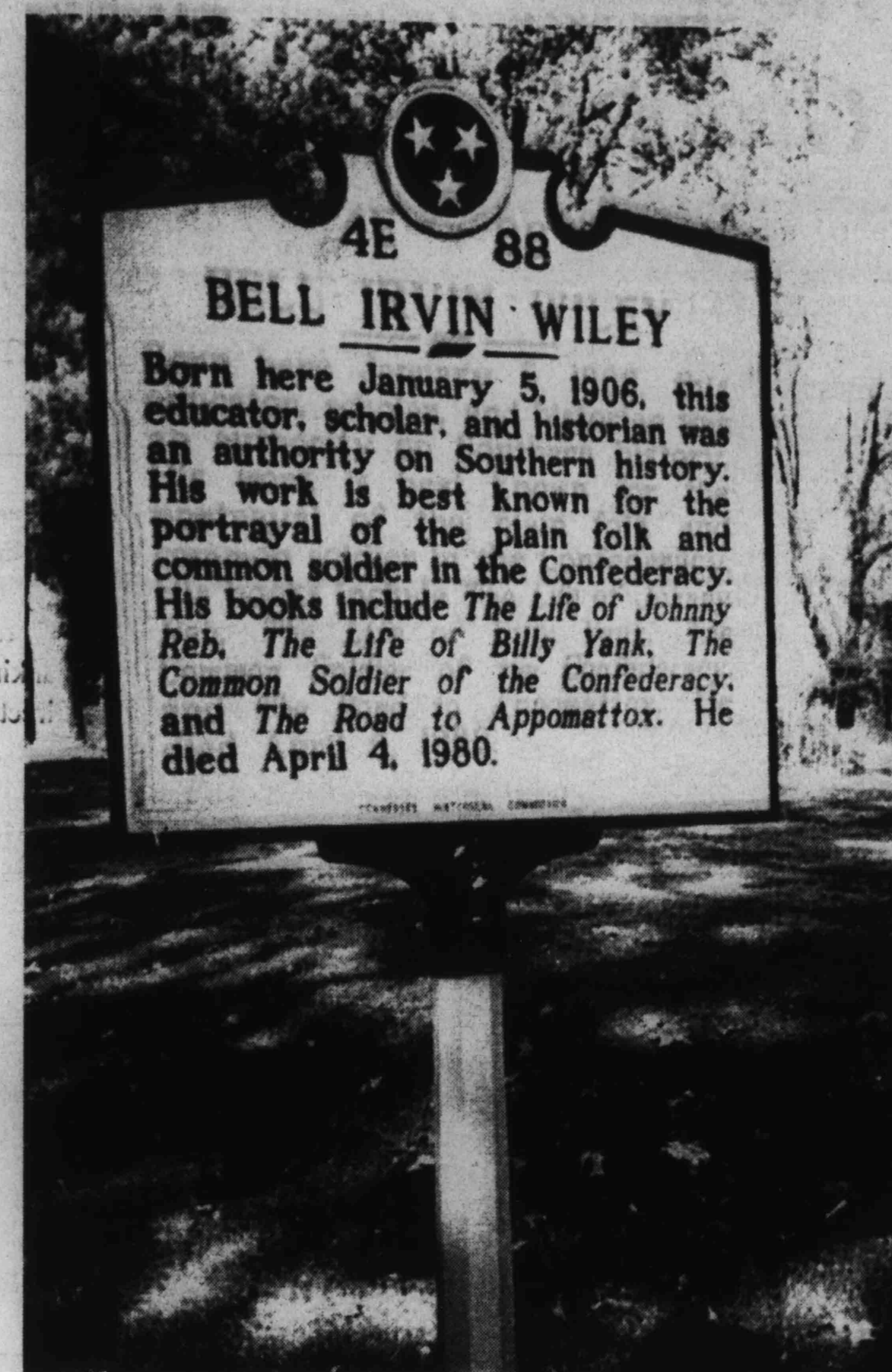

Wiley Memorialized



BELL IRVIN WILEY, born in Halls, Jan. 5, 1906, has been honored by the Tennessee Historical Commission with a historical marker in his honor, placed near the Town of Halls on Hwy. 88 W.

Wiley spent more than fifty years in the classroom as a teacher, and authored or co-authored and edited 24

books. He has been recognized as an eminent Civil War historian. He attended Yale University, where he earned his doctorate in 1933.

His books have included *The Life of Johnny Reb: The Common Soldier of the Confederacy*; *The Life of Billy Yank: The Common Soldier of the Union*; and *Embattled*

Confederates: An Illustrated History of Southerners at War.

During the Civil War Centennial in the early 1960's, he was a member of the Civil War Centennial Commission, and chaired the commission's executive committee.

He was president of the Southern Historical Association, and a historical consultant from 1954-60 to the Joint Chiefs of Staff, Washington, D.C. He received the Gold Medal Award, Washington D.C., and the Civil War Round Table in 1959.

He served during WW II as a First Lieutenant and historical officer for the Second Army, and as assistant historical officer, Headquarters, Army Ground Forces, Washington, D.C. He assisted in the writing of the history of the Army Ground Forces during WW II, and was awarded the Legion of Merit in 1945. He was discharged as a Lieutenant Colonel in 1946, and promoted to Colonel in the U.S. Army Reserve in March of 1961, retiring in 1966. He died April 4, 1980.

Other activities included membership on the American Council of Learned Societies; member of the National Archives Advisory Council, and Chairman of the advisory board of the National Historical Society.

Students who are required to provide proof of immunization will be contacted by the Office of Admissions & Records.

Advanced Studies Program

High school students who qualify for Dyersburg State's Advanced Studies Program should apply for admission, and with their guidance counselor's assistance, see that all admissions requirements - including Computerized Placement Assessment & Support System (COMPASS) testing - are met prior to registering. Students who are eligible for this program may be admitted for either joint or dual enrollment. Dual enrollment is the enrollment of a high school student in one or more specified college courses for which the student will be awarded both high school and college credit; joint enrollment is for college credit only. Auditing a Class

If you wish to audit a class, you may not register for the class until after the day of regular registration. Individuals under the age of 17 may not audit any class without the written permission of the instructor and the Division Dean. Class Attendance & Outside Study

Successful completion of college-level courses requires a specified amount of study outside the classroom as well as within the classroom. Successful completion of a degree program is dependent upon the student's commitment to study beyond the classroom.

When you register for a class and do not attend, you will receive a grade of "F" unless you properly drop. Refer to your catalog or contact the Office of Admissions and Records for more information.

Class Cancellations and Changes

Dyersburg State Community College reserves the right to cancel classes that do not have sufficient enrollment. Divisions offering more than one section of the same course may close sections as necessary to promote the most effective instruction. Instructor assignments are also subject to change.

COL 101 - The College Experience: Teamwork

This course is required for all concentrations under the University Parallel and Nursing majors. This one credit hour course promotes and develops success in college and in the workplace through an orientation to the educational process and teamwork and leadership practices.

Computerized Placement Assessment & Support System (COMPASS) Test

The Computerized Placement Assessment & Support System (COMPASS) test measures competency in reading, writing, and mathematics. While you cannot fail the COMPASS test, your performance will determine if College Preparatory courses will increase your chances for success. There is no fee for the COMPASS. For more information including testing dates, times, and locations, call (731) 286-3355.

If you are required to take the COMPASS test or any portion of it and are placed in the College Preparatory Program, you must enroll in and complete the designated courses in sequence.

Confidentiality of Student Records

DSCC regards a student's academic record as confidential. The release of information contained in the record is governed by Federal Law, known as the *Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)*. Directory information such as the student's name, address, telephone listing, e-mail address, date and place of birth, major field of study, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, and the most recent previous educational agency or institution attended by the student will be released unless the student has asked DSCC to withhold such information. If you do not wish directory information released, please provide written notification to the Office of Admissions and Records.

The law does provide for the release of information to authorized college personnel, other institutions engaged in research (provided information is not revealed to any other parties), and certain federal and state government officials.

If you have questions concerning the provisions of this act, contact the Director of Admissions and Records.

Cost of Attendance at DSCC

During the 2001-2002 academic year, all students whether residents or non-residents of Tennessee, will pay a maintenance fee of \$64 per semester hour not to exceed \$744 per semester. There is also a \$5 facilities assessment fee for all students and a \$3 student activity fee for students enrolling in seven or more hours per semester. A Technology Access Fee is assessed based on the number of credit hours in which the student enrolls. The fee varies from \$40 for three credit hours to \$50 for four credit hours to \$62.50 for five or more credit hours. Fees are subject to change at any time by action of the Tennessee Board of Regents. For students who register after the first day of class, there is a \$10 Late Fee.

Tuition is charged to students who are not residents of Tennessee except for residents of Pemiscot and Dunklin Counties in Missouri and Mississippi County in Arkansas. In addition to the maintenance fees listed previously, students who are classified as out-of-state for fee-paying purposes must pay \$257 per semester hour, not to exceed \$2229 per semester. As with other fees, the amount of tuition is subject to change.

For Regents Online Degree Program (RODP) courses, there is a surcharge of \$16 per credit hour. While RODP courses are not subject to DSCC's Technology Access Fee, there is no maximum limit to the fees for RODP courses.

Dropping Courses

To drop a course, you must complete a Change of Registration form and follow the procedures listed on the form. Forms may be obtained in the Office of Admissions & Records or from your academic advisor or at the Gibson and Tipton County Centers. A student is not officially dropped from a course until this form is processed in the Office of Admissions & Records. Failure to comply will result in a grade of "F". Please refer to the Academic Calendar in this schedule for deadlines to drop. There are times when dropping classes may be accomplished by accessing DSCC's Web Registration & Student Information Access. Check with the Office of Admissions and Records for more information.

Tennessee Board of Regents policy prohibits students from dropping courses in the College Preparatory Program (developmental studies). Under extenuating circumstances, however, a course may be dropped with the approval of the advisor and the Director of the College Preparatory Program.

Courses may be dropped without a grade through approximately the first two weeks (14 calendar days beginning with the first day of class). After this time, a grade of "W" is given if the course is officially dropped.

Dropping Courses Vs. Complete Withdrawal from the College

If you are enrolled in only one course and do not want to remain in that course or if you wish to withdraw from all courses, a Permission to Withdraw form must be obtained and appropriate signatures obtained. Forms are available in the Office of Admissions & Records and the Gibson and Tipton County Centers. Failure to withdraw officially from school will result in an automatic grade of "F" in all courses.

Please refer to the Academic Calendar in this schedule for the deadline to drop. There are times when dropping classes may be accomplished by accessing DSCC's Web Registration & Student Information Access. Check with the Office of Admissions and Records for more information.

Financial Aid

If you have not applied for financial aid and are interested in applying, information can be obtained from the Financial Aid Office, located in the Student Center. Their number is (731) 286-3235.

Grades at Term's End

Grades are not mailed to students at the end of the term but are accessible on the Web. To access your grades, you will need your Social Security Number and your Personal Identification Number (PIN). Students who need to provide a copy of their grades to their employer should request an official copy of their transcript to be mailed directly to the employer. This written request can be made at any time during the term.

To protect the confidential nature of the student's records, no grades will be released by phone.

Grades will not be available until all debts or obligations owed to the College have been satisfied.

Graduation Candidates

Students expecting to complete course requirements at the end of 2001 Fall, 2002 Spring, or 2002 Summer should submit an Intent to Graduate form to the Office of Admissions & Records by October 26. Forms are available in the Office of Admissions & Records or at the Gibson and Tipton County Centers.

Honors Program

The Honors Program provides exceptional educational opportunities for highly motivated and well-prepared students. The program works individually with students in planning their educational experiences at Dyersburg State Community College. Students may earn Honors distinction by meeting these requirements: completion of a minimum of 12 hours of Honors course work; participation in the Honors Seminar; and participation in at least 2-3 special college educational/cultural events a year. To become a member of the Honors program, an incoming freshman must have a minimum ACT composite of 26 and a 3.5 high school grade point average (GPA). An existing student must have a minimum GPA of 3.5. To remain in the program, a student must maintain a minimum GPA of 3.5. An appropriate Honors distinction is indicated on the student's transcript and is recognized at graduation.

Possession of Weapons

T.C.A. 39-17-1309 prohibits the possession of weapons, including firearms, on any property owned, used or operated by Dyersburg State Community College. Furthermore, State Law prescribes a maximum penalty of six (6) years imprisonment and a fine not to exceed three thousand dollars (\$3000) for carrying weapons on school property.

Proof of Immunization

Unless exempted under Tennessee Code Annotated, proof of immunization with two doses of Measles, Mumps, and Rubella vaccines, administered on or after the first birthday, is required for attendance to all universities and colleges with an enrollment of greater than two hundred students. Students who are required to provide proof of immunization will be contacted by the Office of Admissions and Records.

Refund Policy

Refund procedures for maintenance fees and out-of-state tuition fees are outlined below. (All other fees are non-refundable)

Change of student's status which requires refund:

- Change in a full-time student's schedule which results in reclassification to part-time student status,
- Change in a part-time student's schedule which results in a class load of fewer hours during a refund period.

Other situations which require a refund:

- Withdrawing from the institution within the refund period,
- Cancellation of a class by the institution,
- Death of the student.

Refund Procedures

Refunds will be calculated for up to 60% of the term for first-time students at DSCC who withdraw from school and are receiving Title IV aid. Refunds for all other students will be calculated as follows:

- Refunds are allowed for the first 25% of the term. Beginning with the first official day of classes and extending through the first 14 calendar days of classes, there is a 75% refund. For the remaining days of this refund period, there is a 25% refund. *No refunds will be made beyond the 25% period.*
- 100% of the fees will be refunded for classes canceled by the institution.
- 100% of the fees will be refunded for "drops" or "withdrawals" prior to the beginning of the first official day of classes. No refund will be processed during the official registration period.
- 100% refund in case of student's death.

Refund policy for students receiving Title IV aid is subject to change by the Federal Government.

Registering after the First Official Day of Classes

Students who register for a class after the first official day of classes need to be aware that enrollment in classes is not guaranteed but may depend on the number of classes missed and the instructor's assessment of the student's chances for success in the course. Students who register late will need to meet with the instructor to discuss any work that has been missed and to complete and sign the form for *Late Class Entry: Student & Teacher Agreement to Make Up Missed Work*

Student Load

A student is considered to be enrolled full-time if enrolled in 12 or more credit hours; the maximum number of hours credit for which a student may enroll is 19 hours. A student may request to enroll in more than 19 hours. Request for Overload forms are available from academic advisors or from the Office of Admissions and Records. You must obtain your advisor's signature on the form and meet specific requirements as outlined in the DSCC catalog before an overload can be processed.

2. Tornado and Fire Alert

- A. Tornado Alert
- a. Dyersburg Campus-In case of tornado alert, the alarm system will give a series of 10 short rings. Students should calmly file to interior hallway, away from windows and doors. One long ring sounds the all clear.
- b. Gibson County and Tipton County Centers- When the National Weather Service issues a Tornado Warning, an air horn will be sounded in a series of short blasts. When bad weather occurs, announcements will distinguish between day and evening classes, and classes, and classes will be subject to a delayed schedule as in the case of day classes or cancellation.
