WTRB and TV Channel 5 will still broadcast any closing due to weather. Parents can call 635-2941 and enter 43 when prompted, the recorded announcement will cover, closings, parent teacher conferences, holidays, etc. The information will be posted as soon as the Superintendent makes the decision to close schools.

Some parents and children try to call WTRB, tying up the phone lines and preventing factories and even school officials from providing the radio

station with their closing information. The voice mail system at the department will be able to handle several calls and will allow WTRB to broadcast other news and closings.

# Frist Presents A New Health Bill

U. S. Senator Bill Frist introduced legislation to improve early detection and preventive health measures for uninsured and low-income women. The bill would provide screening services for preventable diseases such as osteoporosis and cardiovascular disease, as well as breast and cervical cancers. The "Wisewoman Expansion Act of 2001" builds on the "Well-Integrated Screening and Evalution for Women in Massachusetts, Arizona, and North Carolina" demonstration program which was reauthorized in Frist's 1998 "Women's Health Research and Prevention Amendments." The bill would authorize \$15 million for fiscal year 2002, \$20 million for FY 2003, and \$25 million for FY 2004. It would permit the Centers for Disease Control to expand the program to an additional four to eight states each year, with the intent that it would expand until all states were participating.

According to the American Heart Association, Tennessee has the second highest death rate from heart disease, stroke, and other cardiovascular diseases in the nation. 

The Tennessee Dept. of Education's Arts Education Office is the state liaison for the contest, which is coordinated by the Nashville Savings Bonds Office.


